J. W. Weatherford, Sec 2 T 20 N R 6 E. The Board approved the applications to lease the School and University lands as follows: I. M. Jackson, Sec 36, T 30 N R 1 W. Mrs. Margaret Jackson, Sec 36, T 30 N R 2 W. D. D. Smith, Sec 16, T 24 N R 1 E. Leatie Smith, Sec 36, T 25, N R 1 W. The Board of Supervisors then proceeded to open the bids as advertised, there being only one bid for the County Hospital, that of L. E. Johnson, for the care of the indigents confined in the County Hospital for the sum of 75c per day and furnishing meals for the prisoners confined in the county jail at 25c per meal. The contract was awarded to L. E. Johnson. There being but one bid in for County Physician at \$20.00 per month, the contract was awarded to G. F. Manning, Jr. for Flagstaff Precinct. There being but one bid in for the County Printing, that of the Coconino Sun, the contract was awarded to the Sun as follows: Publishing the proceedings of the Board of Supervisors, 10c per inch. Publishing all advertisements, notices, proclamations, notices of increase assessments, and all other notices required to be published by law, 35c per inch for the first insertion, and 15c per inch for each subsequent insertion. The miscellaneous printing figures are on file in the Board of Supervisors office subject to inspection. The bond of L. E. Johnson, for the sum of \$5000.00 as Superintendent of the County Hospital was approved. Dr. Thos. P. Manning was appointed Superintendent of Public Health and Register of Vital Statistics, for two years as required by law. F. O.
