Letter From Picket Post

Regular correspondence of the Herald.

PICKET POST, Jan. 16, 1879.

Editor HERALD:—A test of the ore (from surface), from the Goodenough mine yielded as follows: yield from two tons of ore, from which the richest ore had been selected, one bar in bullion weighing 240 ounces, about 900 fine. Down at Stone & Benson's mill preparations are now being made to test the above mine and mill to their utmost capacity.
