LEGISLATIVE.

Special to the HERALD.

Saturday's Proceedings.

ASSEMBLY.

PRESCOTT, February 9.—Mr. Buf-

fun introduced a bill amendatory to an act to amend and to restrict chapter 52, Howard code, in reference to the incorporation of villages.

A bill creating the office of attorney general was made special order for Monday.

Council bill for the maintenance of a government assay office was read the first time.

The county recorder's bill will be the special order for Monday.

A bill relating to appeals from justices' courts was laid on the table.

An act to amend section 4 of chapter 42, compiled laws, on conveyances, was laid on the table.

The council bill making an apportionment of the legislative assembly bond on the census of 1880, was read the first time.

A bill for keeping in repair the road between Phenix and Prescott passed.

A bill to repeal an act to secure the construction of certain railroad and telegraph lines was read the first time.

Mr. Hamilton offered a substitute regulating freights and fares, and repealing an act exempting the Southern Pacific from taxation, which was defeated by a vote of 12 to 6. He gave notice that he would move to reconsider the action Monday.

The Hughes gambling bill passed to a second reading and was referred to the judiciary.

An amendment was adopted to include Yavapai.

The omnibus road bill, which includes all the road projects, was defeated, but a reconsideration will be moved on Monday.

Bill to divorce Mary Showers from Jackson Showers passed.

Mr. Fay introduced a bill to protect marriage relations in the territory, reflecting on the numerous divorce acts, which caused much merriment in the house, and it was finally referred to the committee of the whole.

The governor has signed the following bills:

An act to provide for the erection of county buildings in Maricopa.

An act authorizing the common council of Prescott to make certain alterations in a certain alley.

An act to divorce certain parties.
