TERRITORIAL ITEMS.

Tucson will celebrate the Fourth. Many rich mineral discoveries are reported around Tucson. Hon. M. W. Stewart has gone on a trip to California. Smelting works will shortly be erected in Patagonia district. Judge Tucker is now associated with Fitch & Churchill. Mitchell, the Prescott photographer, is now taking views in the Big Bug District. James B. Thompson of Colorado, has been nominated Indian Agent for San Carlos. D. B. Gillett is engaged in mining operations in the Hershaw district, below Tucson. The wife and family of Major Toole of Tucson has gone on a visit to the States. The Supervisors of Pima County, meet July 7 as a Board of Equalization. A. C. Swift, of Globe city, is registered at the Grand Hotel San Francisco. Chief Justice French has appointed George A. Clum, Clerk of the District Court of Pima County. The backboards on the Prescott & Santa Fe mail line are now running regularly three times a week. Extensive and destructive fires have raged for weeks past in the San Catarina and Rincon mountains within sight of Tucson. Prescott is making active preparations for the celebration of the Fourth. The committee have been appointed and will report next Monday evening. Suit has been commenced in the District Court of Pima county, against the Calabasas Land and Mining Company for \$100,000. The prisoners in the county jail at Prescott are employed in digging post holes around the plaza. The Council having to fence it and proposals will be received until June 23. The funeral of Mother Mary John Buchman, born Mary Hartwick, took place in Prescott, Monday morning. The deceased was the Superior of the Sisters of Charity having charge of the village hospital. The Democratic County Convention of Yavapai met last Saturday at Prescott. The Secretary was instructed to transmit a communication to our Delegate, requesting him to use his utmost endeavors for the passage of the bill now pending in Congress providing for the election of Territorial officials. Judge Tucker addressed the meeting, urging organization. A county committee of thirteen members was appointed. Meeting adjourned without day. Mr. Frank Parker, one of the Clipper Mill Lumber Company, informs the Enterprise that their new chisel, tooth saw, which they have just received from R. Hoe & Co., New York, and which they have just placed in position in their mill, on last Friday cut 18,000 feet of lumber, the biggest run ever made in the Territory. Messrs. Parker have now one of the most complete saw mills in Arizona, situated in a fine grove of pine timber, near Thumb Butte, a short distance from Prescott, and with a good road running to their mill, they offer extra inducements to all who wish to patronize them.
