TELEGRAPHIC BREVITIES.

Prince Napoleon left no will. General Negrelle has sent a message of submission and asks the clemency of the Mexican Government. A national subscription is proposed to purchase ground at Chisellhurst for the tomb of the Prince Imperial. Snow fell at Gilver City, Idaho, on the 18th ult. to the depth of six inches. Senator Blaine has gone to Maine and will not return during the remainder of this session. The Crescent City Oil Works at Mechanicsville, Mass., were burned yesterday. Loss, \$115,000; insurance, \$115,000. The H. B.'s of California have nominated Dr. Glenn of Colusa for Governor and J. R. West of Los Angeles for Lieutenant Governor. Albert Weber, piano manufacturer, who died in New York on the 26th ult. leaves an estate valued at from \$500,000 to \$750,000. A meeting was held in Chicago Tuesday to establish a bi-metallic league. Object, to restore silver to its old position, as a money metal. The thermometer in New York was nearly 100 degrees in the shade—the warmest day this season. Several cases of sun stroke occurred. The Senate in executive session confirmed the nomination of Joseph S. Smith to be Collector of Customs for the District of Bangor, Maine. W. W. Hume, treasurer of a traveling variety show, Chicago, vainly tried to shoot a former mistress, Minnie Bertram, and supposing he had killed her, he shot himself dead. It is rumored that Governor Hartranft intends shortly to resign the Philadelphia Postmastership, aiming to succeed Judge McCrary as Secretary of War. Edward Learned has received a grant from the Mexican Government to assist in building a railroad 150 miles in length across the Tehuantepec Isthmus. A fire starting in the Powder Company's frame shop in Webster, Mass., destroyed the building and an adjoining grist mill and foundry. Loss, \$50,000; insured. Police Officer Nugent of New York has been held in the sum of \$10,000 bail, charged with complicity in robbing the Manhattan Savings Institution. Cincinnati, Ohio, June 28th. John Jung, keeper of a disreputable house at Carthage, a short distance of Cincinnati was shot and fatally wounded by his son. Young Jung was put in jail. Advice from the Cape Town to the 10th of June, state that the Prince Imperial, after the surprise of his reconnoitering party, rode into a ravine where a second body of Zulus lay concealed. His body will be conveyed to England. A terrific rain storm swept over Griffin, Texas, on the night of the 20th. Over eight inches of water fell, flooding the town and causing Collins creek to overflow. Three people were drowned in town and four others just below. There was immense damage to property. Aizpurua, who started the revolution in Aspinwall on the 7th instant, surrendered his men and officers, who are allowed amnesty for political offenses, but their violations of common law must be a matter for subsequent investigation. Mollie McCarty won the Garden City cup race at Chicago, Wednesday. Purse \$1,500. Twelve of the most celebrated horses in the country entered. It was the most interesting race ever run in America. The Department of State has received a telegram from the Consul-General at Cairo stating that the Khedive, in accordance with an order of the Sultan, has abdicated in favor of his son, Prince Tefik, who will be proclaimed Khedive at the Capital.
