WASHINGTON WILL WELCOME

Elaborate Preparations for the Coming Pythian Encampment. WORK OF THE SUB-COMMITTEES

What the Visitors May Expect in the Form of Entertainment—Address of Welcome by the Vice President, Commissioner Ross, and Other Prominent Citizens Interested.

Washington will be invaded by an army next month, the Knights of Pythias Army of the Lily. According to the latest reports and estimates, they and their many friends are coming more than 100,000 strong.

Two years ago the supreme lodge decided to hold its next session in this city, and a few months after that date the local regiment of knights put their heads together and began to select gentlemen who in their judgment were capable of providing proper entertainment for the knights of the different States.

They worked along for more than a year and decided that as the citizens of Washington had to be the order would be necessarily have a large part to perform in housing and feeding the many thousands who come, it would only be proper to have a citizens' committee appointed.

In accordance with the Pythians' request Commissioner Ross named the following gentlemen to act on the citizens' committee: Chapin Brown, Thomas G. Alvord, Jr., Geo. E. Emmons, Archibald Greenless, Samuel Ross, John Joy Edson, Major F. H. Clarke, Lawrence Gardner, Gen. Duncan S. Walker, Hon. C. G. Conn, and J. Harrison Johnson.

At another meeting of the citizens' committee, one week later, a permanent organization was effected, with the following officers: Chairman, Mr. Chapin Brown; vice chairman, Mr. Thomas G. Alvord, Jr.; secretary, Mr. George E. Emmons, and treasurer, Mr. John R. Carmody.

The secretary of the committee, Mr. George E. Emmons, is one of Washington's most successful business men. He was also connected with the Grand Army encampment as secretary of the executive committee, having the arrangement for that encampment.

UP TO DATE rooms have been registered which will lodge comfortably about 40,000 persons, and the committee expect to have sufficient accommodations for all who will come.

The past week has been an unusually busy one in Pythian circles. Secretary Smith, of the public comfort sub-committee, has been one of the hardest worked men on the citizens committee.

During the six days ending yesterday afternoon accommodations for several thousand more visitors have been registered, making a total, including hotels, of 40,000. At this rate it is thought the committee will have enough accommodations for probably by the 20th of August.

The only complaint now made is that the out-of-town knights are not applying for quarters rapidly enough to satisfy the public comfort committee. Members of the committee are fearful that this important matter will be postponed until just before the encampment begins.
