MIMICRY OF MIDWINTER

Washington L. I. Armory the Scene of Beauty and Grandeur. Successful Opening of the 'Evening in Iceland' Entertainment—Brilliant Display of Artistic Effects.

The finishing touches have been given to the artistic embellishment of the inner recesses of Washington Light Infantry Armory, the corps donated its military clothes last night, turned on its ten thousand electric lights, and opened its doors upon a scene of wondrous brilliancy and beauty.

O'Rand, and Company D, commanded by Capt. Miller. With a vast amount of military music, the parade was led by Capt. Allison Naylor, as chairman of the committee, to effect the transfer.

To His Col. Moore responded, expressing his admiration at the wonderful effects produced, and, metaphorically pressing the button, he complimented his well-known audience by turning over the leadership of the evening to the development of the program. Col.
