

ROLED BY CORN AND STEEL

The Stock Market Swayed by the Crops and the Strike.

Effects of the Government Report Showing in the Railway List-Labor Trouble Less Gloomy-Sugar Retailing Suffers a Sharp Decline.

NEW YORK, Aug. 12.—Dealings in the stock market were quiet and unimportant today. The market was swayed by the effects of the government report showing in the railway list-labor trouble less gloomy-sugar retailing suffers a sharp decline.

As regards the two dominating factors in the market situation, it is still difficult to speak with any degree of certainty. Estimates of the probable corn harvest, derived from the percentages furnished by the Department of Agriculture, indicated a yield ranging from 1,250,000,000 to 1,350,000,000 bushels.

On top, however, of the Government's reduced estimates Wall Street is now told that since the first week of the month the crop has become further seriously impaired, and that it is now idle to look for a harvest of more than 1,100,000,000 bushels.

The business situation contains many favorable items which conservative people believe far outweigh the unfavorable ones. The outlook is not so bright as it has been, but it is not so dark as it has been.

General trade conditions are fine, as evidenced by the big bank clearings, and by the general increase in railway earnings during the past month.

Price movements, after the opening, were exceedingly irregular and trading fell away materially in volume.

The only other important movements in the market were those in People's Gas, which recovered sharply, and in Amalgamated Copper, which appeared to be better supported than for a number of days.

The grain market, however, and corn particularly, continued exceedingly strong. The latter staple showed an upward tendency, the greater part of an advance of 2 cents a bushel.

As regards the steel strike, this morning's intelligence was unambiguously encouraging. The refusal of the employees of the Illinois Steel Company to accept the general strike order issued by President Shaffer would indicate that the cause of the Amalgamated Association is tottering.

The money market was easy. The renewed firmness of sterling exchange and the large batch of gratifying returns of railway traffic were among the factors mentioned in the day's dealings.
