Awarded \$6,700 Damages. In her suit against the City and Suburban Railroad Company for \$80,000, claimed as damages for personal injuries, Mrs. Hedwig E. Seved-Moore, yesterday awarded \$6,700. The trial of the cause was begun Monday in Circuit Court No. 1. Lippcomb & Jaeger appeared in counsel for the plaintiff.

An irreparable loss was sustained yesterday morning by the American Rose Company in the destruction of a number of valuable plants in one of their greenhouses, destroyed by fire. The fire occurred in the greenhouse, located near King Street. It is believed that the fire originated from a preparation which was being used for the destruction of insects. An alarm was sounded from box 678, to which Engines 8 and 10 and Truck A responded. The damage to the building is estimated at \$200.


Allowed \$20 Monthly Alimony.
