SHOPPERS IN BOAT PANIC.
Barge Sunk and a Steamer Benched Near Bridgeport.

BRIDGEPORT, Conn., Dec. 24.—Panic followed a collision between the steamer Allen Joy, of the Bridgeport line, and a tug and coal-laden tow in Bridgeport harbor yesterday afternoon. The barge James T. Easton was sunk and the steamer was benched, as it was feared her hull was damaged. None of the passengers were injured.

DELaware River Frozen.

MORE POLICE ARE NEEDED.

Patrol Area Larger Than Any City in Country.

SYLVESTER PRAISES THE FORCE.

Says Darniss Case Is Only One in Which Perpetrator of Serious Crime Has Not Been Apprehended—Force Too Small to Properly Guard District.

The smallness of the police force of the District is to a certain extent responsible for the recent outbreak of crime which for a time startled the community and threatened panic among the feminine portion of the city's population. This is the substance of a statement given out yesterday by Major Richard Sylvester, of the local Police Department.

He calls attention to the fact that the mystery surrounding all of these cases has been cleared away and the guilty parties placed under arrest, with the exception of one case—that of the assault upon Mrs. Ada Gilbert Dennis on the 10th instant. Even that case, he believes, will be soon cleared away and leave Washington with the enviable record of being the only city of consequence in the United States where during an administration of the length of his, no crime has been committed of which the perpetrator has not been apprehended.

This force has been able to accomplish through capable and intelligent work, but the time must soon come, he believes, when the force at her command will be so small as to not only be unable to prevent crime, but in some instances to detect the criminals.

Major Sylvester's statement. "Stealing will always prevail here. Several horrible crimes have been committed in the past three months, and but one of these remains to be cleared up, and it is the first mystery which has challenged the detectives in years."

"Coming all at one time, after months of freedom from tragedies, the conditions alarmed the community. The Franklin Square assault was a myth, but the District should be more numerous policed than any other jurisdiction to keep down disorders, as the force is insufficient numerically now."

The District police area is the fourth largest in the United States, being exceeded by that of Greater New York, Chicago and Philadelphia. Baltimore has less than half the area of the District of Columbia; Boston about half; Cincinnati 1,848; Cleveland 1,300; Detroit 1,100; Louisville about one-third; Milwaukee one-third and Pittsburgh slightly in excess of one-third.

"Applying the same rule to other municipalities, it is not only of importance that the lives and property of the densely populated sections of the District be guarded as in the densely populated sections of the whole area, it is important that the lives and property of the less densely populated sections of the District be guarded as in the densely populated sections of the whole area."

"Where population is concentrated it is less difficult to establish a police system than where it is scattered; and in municipalities where the population is confined to inextensive districts, so is the police force."

"The District contains virtually two cities in its territory. The one is a city in the sense that it is a seat of government with its employees and patrons, making it a rendezvous for not only the learned scientist, the statesman, the diplomat, and the visitor, but for that unfortunate class who labor under various hallucinations inclined to political and other excitement."

"The District is a territory geographically separated from crime of great magnitude, such as murder and highway robbery, and which are generally confined to the lower and irregular class. The few named crimes occur in ten or twelve instances a year in the District, but when other localities are heard from, with daily occurrences, the District rating is low."

"It is not made manifest by the statistics pertaining to arrests or complaints that crime in the District has increased in every respect. The number of cases of arrest exceed those of former years, but this is a result of the more stringent enforcement of the police regulations."

"Cases are unquestionably greater during the seasons of abundance, money and valuables being more plentiful and more exposed. In this jurisdiction there are fewer thefts of great magnitude than elsewhere with an equal population, but petty larceny has always prevailed on an extensive scale. Dishonest employees are a feature of the District, which contribute largely to this condition. Social surroundings in this community are such as to prompt stringent measures with respect to their control."

"Cases of assault occur more frequently than formerly, and the whipping post is not without infringing upon the law of humanity. On the principle that violations against the person are more serious in hot weather than cold weather, the increase of such crimes in the District over the prior year is justified, but as to murder and assault with intent to kill the same is not sustained, a favorable decrease being noted."

TENANT FOR HOSPITAL SITE.

Superintendent of Parking to Take the Helmüller House.

The Helmüller homestead on Brightwood Avenue, at the corner of Richmond Street, is about to be vacated, the property having been sold to the District last year as the site of the proposed municipal hospital.

Truman Lanham, the Superintendent of Parks, has made application to the Commissioners that the buildings be turned over to the Parking Commission for use in connection with the municipal nursery for trees already started on the place.

W. P. Richards, Assistant Engineer of the Surface Division, in reporting upon the matter, says that inasmuch as the buildings will be likely to remain for several years, he thinks that tenants should be secured for them who keep the surroundings in good condition. He therefore recommends that the Superintendent of Parking be allowed the use of this building until such time as it becomes necessary to remove it.

Mr. Richards states that this will result in advantage to the District, as then Mr. Lanham can inspect the nursery work before coming to his office, which he cannot do now, owing to the distance of the nursery from his home.

MAY WITHHOLD LICENSE.
Master Plumbers Must Make Satisfactory Explanation of Work.

In the case of A. R. Shepherd, who recently applied for license as a master plumber, Commissioner Biddle has sent a recommendation to his associates to the effect that the explanation offered relative to the work done by Shepherd in houses on Kenesaw Avenue is not satisfactory, and that unless a statement that is satisfactory to the board is forthcoming, the application for license will have to be denied.

Colonel Biddle says that it is difficult for his office to keep the interior plumbing of houses entirely under observation, and that unless a statement that is satisfactory to the board is forthcoming, the application for license will have to be denied.

GRADING THE SIDEWALKS.
Plan to Save the District Unnecessary Expense.

The Computing Engineer of the District has forwarded to the Commissioners a recommendation that the proposal of M. F. Talty to grade the sidewalk spaces in the square bounded by S. T. and North Capitol Streets and Lincoln Avenue at 20 cents a square yard.

The Computing Engineer says that the contractor is grading the entire square for property holders with a steam shovel. The cost of the grading therefore will be less than it could otherwise be done.

The engineer says that a similar arrangement was effected recently to the advantage of the District in the grading of an alley in the same locality.

PIERCE MILL ROAD BLOCKED.
Reasons Stated for Temporary Closing of the Street.

Several weeks ago the District Commissioners received a protest from Richard P. Paire against the tearing in of the Pierce Mill Road immediately south of certain property in Rosemont Park.

Mr. Paire said that access to the property had been practically shut off by the action of the District, and he asked that the road might be restored to its former condition.

W. P. Richards, Assistant Engineer in the Surface Division, has reported to the Commissioners relative to the matter that the closing of the Pierce Mill Road was only temporary in connection with the opening of Columbus Avenue and the abandonment of the bridge over Piney Branch on the Pierce Mill Road.

Mr. Richards says that the road has now been restored to its former condition, and that some minor repairs only will be required to put it in as good condition as before it was barricaded.

TO CHANGE STREET NAMES.

Bill Proposing New Designations for Alphabetical Thoroughfares.

In framing their report upon House bill No. 317, the District Commissioners have adopted the suggestion of the Engineer Commissioner, and will ask Congress to delay action upon the subject until the plan of the Commissioners for the naming of streets in the District shall have been completed.

The bill in question prescribed for the streets named alphabetically the names of noted men, the list being Adams, Bancroft, Clay, Deatur, Emerson, Franklin, Grant, Hamilton, Irving, Kane, Lincoln, Marshall, Newcomb, Ogden, Perry, Quincy, Randolph, Stanton, Taylor, Union, Van Hook, and Webster.

W. P. Richards, of the Surface Division, in reporting upon the matter, recommended that the one-syllable names of the scheme for naming streets be substituted for those in the bill.

Ames, Blaine, Clay, Dix, Eads, Foster, Grant, Hayes, Jay, King, Lee, Meade, Nash, Ord, Polk, Quarles, Rusk, Scott, Tatt, Van, and Wier.

EXTENDING N. Y. AVENUE.
Curve Proposed Where It Crosses the Railroad Tracks.

The District Commissioners have received a recommendation from William H. Reardon, chief engineer of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, in which he makes certain suggestions relative to the proposed extension of New York Avenue from Florida Avenue to the Bladenburg Road.

Mr. Brown calls attention to House bill 25, which provides for this extension, and asks that it be so amended as to make a better junction with the new line of railroad in connection with the union terminal system.

Mr. Brown asks that New York Avenue be curved around parallel with the new line of railroad where the avenue strikes S Street to the right of way of the old Baltimore and Ohio Railroad and then along the old right of way back to the original line. Mr. Brown says that such an arrangement would save the expense to his company of building a long and expensive bridge across the river at the angle, and he thinks it would be better for the purpose of traffic.

The Commissioners have taken the matter under advisement and will inform the company of their views upon the subject when the bill referred to is acted on.

TIME FOR CONTRACTOR.
Extra Work Allowed for an Expired Agreement.

The Superintendent of Repairs has forwarded to the Commissioners a proposal of W. E. Mooney to change the location of pump and receiver in the boiler of the Jefferson School boiler house for the sum of \$75.

Capt. Chester Harding, in charge of the Department of Repairs, has forwarded to the Commissioners relative to the matter to the effect that the time of the contract for the construction of the boiler house has expired, and that the contractor is completing the work with the cost of inspection charged to him.

Capt. Harding states, however, that the work proposed with reference to the changing of the pump and the pipes is extra work, and that the contractor should not be held responsible for its execution under the original contract, so far as the time limit is concerned.

Captain Harding recommends that the work be regarded as separate from the original contract in the particular mentioned.
