MARKET QUOTATIONS

New York Cotton Letter. New York, Jan. 20.—The fluctuations in the cotton future market continued narrow to-day. There was a fair demand on the declines, some cotton being taken for the account of interests identified with the investment trade, the theory was expressed that eventually the demand for actual cotton would assume larger proportions, and that later on, all of the cotton now being held back in the country would be taken up readily as it came forward. The receipts were small to-day and the week end statistics were about as expected. The foreign advices were without special feature so far as prices were concerned, but there appeared to be a better demand for actual cotton and continental spinners were said to be making preparations to take on greater blocks of cotton in the near future. The indications point to a continued narrow and rather feverish market. O'HALLORAN.

Review Says Statements Were True. The last issue of the Naval Stores Review, published at Savannah, says: Our beloved friends of the Jacksonville Record have had a spasm of vituperation again and denounce the statements made by the Review as to the increase of production in the territory south of Jessup to Bainbridge as a lie. The Review's statements were based on reports furnished to it by Dr. E. F. Rose, formerly of the West Coast Naval Stores Co., and one of the most reliable producers, and was further confirmed by the published reports in the Valdosta Times and the Savannah Morning News of the proceedings of the meeting held at Valdosta several weeks ago. Take it all in all, we are inclined to believe that producers will be more inclined to accept the statements of Dr. Rose and of these two thoroughly reliable papers, than they will be to swallow the assertions of the Record.

As to the officer of the T. O. A. who has increased his crop prospects for next year by a very large percentage, although he signed a circular requesting producers to hold down production, we merely desire now to state that the information came from a thoroughly reliable producer and was undoubtedly true. We shall have more to say on this score next week.

BIG CORPORATION HAS BEEN FORMED

THE WEST PENSACOLA LAND COMPANY WILL DO BUSINESS IN PENSACOLA.

The West Pensacola Land Company is the name of a new corporation which has been formed in Pensacola for the purpose of transacting a general real estate and land business, and from the names of the promoters of the company it will be one of the strongest concerns of its kind in the country. Notice of application for a charter chartering the company has just been made to Governor Broward, and will be acted upon at an early date. Among the stockholders are Jas. M. Muldon, J. R. Saunders, Wm. S. Keyser, Thos. C. Watson, Jas. C. Watson, J. J. Hooton and A. C. Blount, Jr. The officers of the corporation, until the first election, are Jas. M. Muldon, president and J. J. Hooton, secretary and treasurer. The capital stock of the company is announced at \$30,000, and business will be commenced at an early date.

LOOMIS WILL TAKE AN EXTENDED VACATION.

New York, Jan. 20.—The directors of the National City Bank accepted today the resignation of Archibald G.
