PITCH PINE MARKET CONDITIONS AND EXPORTS

REVIEW OF PAST WEEK BY GULF COAST RECORD—INCREASING DEMAND IS SHOWN AND CUT IS SMALL.

The following is from the Gulf Coast Record for the week ending January 28:

Freight Market Conditions.

Timber.—There is no material change to note. The fixtures are: Str. Sellaria, 2263, Mobile and Gulf port to St. John, N. B., p. t.; str. Maylands, 1618, Gulf to Cont. p. t.; str. Miles Coverdale, 1475, Gulf to U. K. and Cont. p. t.; bk. Michael Berentzen, 604, Mobile to Cont. p. t.; bk. Casabona, 1297, Pensacola to Cont. p. t.; str. Uppland, 1550, Gulf to Gibraltar or Aberdeen, 85 s. Mch.; several steamers Gulf to Holland, 82-8 s. Mch.; two Randman boats about 1,300 stds., Mobile to U. K., April, May, June, p. t.

River Plate.—No improvement in rates and freights are scarce. The only fixtures reported was Bk Ragland Castle, 1050, Pensacola to Montevideo, p. t., Mch.

West Indies.—Tonnage is freely tendered and rates show no improvement. The fixtures are: Sch. Expection, 380, Fernandez to n. s. Cuba, \$5.00; sch. Melrose, 637, Gulfport to Port Antonio, \$6.00; sch. Ira B. Ellis, 264, Gulf to n. s. Cuba, two trips, \$5.25; sch. Elsie A. Bayles, 252, Gulf to Havana, p. t.; sch. Asa T. Stowell, 345, Gulfport to Coulon, p. t.

Pitch Pine Market Conditions.

Sawn Timber.—The sawn timber market retains all of its buoyancy and values are firm. Another contract for 10,000 pcs has been signed at Mobile p. t. The cut is small. Late offers indicate an advance at foreign ports and an increasing demand. The arrivals at Mobile were 1,200 pcs, and the city mills made 1,600 pcs. The future course of the market will depend entirely upon the cut and there are, at this writing, no indications of any increase. The small "river mills," hitherto a source of supply for sawn lumber, are not running. When the drop in sawn occurred last summer and the price went down to 14c, these mills shut down and many of them have never resumed operations and some are offering their land for sale. Shippers are not forcing the market and report a gradual stiffening of values abroad. The outward movement is small, shippers being inclined to hold their stock until late spring. Stocks on the Gulf have increased 13,000 pcs since last report. It is evident that business is being conducted on a better basis this season. The manufacturer is determined not to sell his produce below cost and the shipper intends selling only at a profit. Gulf manufacturers occupy a strong position financially at present. Except in one instance, no large advances have been made on contracts, hence the manufacturers are in a position to get full market prices.

Logs.—The mills are fairly well supplied. The arrivals at Mobile were 1,000 to the mills and 3,000 on the market. Pearl River had but a slight rise and about 4,000 came in to the mills. The divers are down. Values are high all over the Gulf, quotations at Mobile being \$7 to \$10.

Hewn.—Arrivals at Mobile were 160 pcs and sales were 60 pcs, \$5 cu ft.
