OPPOSES CONVICT LEASE SYSTEM

SAVANNAH PAPER FAVORS WORKING CONVICTS ON THE ROADS BUT NOT IN PRIVATE ENTERPRISE.

The Savannah Press advocates the working of state convicts on the public roads and opposes the lease system, and among other things, says:

"In Florida the convicts are turned over to the lessees by the commissioner of agriculture, who is also commissioner of immigration and two or three other things. This thrifty statesman hands the state prisoners over to the lessees, the state gets its pay and that's about all there is to it in Florida.

"It seems to us that Georgia works along more enlightened lines. This state has her convict commission, with three able and efficient officers, who look carefully into the condition of the state convicts, and who from time to time report to the Governor and General Assembly. The plan costs money, of course. The state does not get the entire returns from the hiring of the convicts, for a great state like Georgia really owes something to its criminals— it pays men to supervise them, to guard them, to administer to their illness and look to their general improvement. The state has no right to farm out the punishment of its convicts to other people. In the interest of convenience it is sometimes done, but the state should always keep in touch with its unfortunates and intervene between these creatures and their masters. At one time Georgia followed the Florida plan, but Georgia learned, as Florida will learn, that convict leases must be strictly supervised and the prisoners closely followed up.

State is Sovereign. "The state is sovereign and when the state assumes to punish its convicts it invokes a sovereign right. At one time the ancient governments used to farm out the collection of taxes to outsiders, but this gave rise to oppression. So the system of farming out punishment at so much per head has brought public scandal to the different states. Georgia does not begrudge salaries paid to the prison commissioners, for they represent the authority of the state and enforce the laws of the state. They safeguard the convicts in every possible way and keep the penal system up to a higher plane.

"Florida, after awhile, will follow the lead of Georgia and probably put some of her convicts on the public roads, where their services may be of direct benefit to the people. We believe that this plan will meet with greater favor year after year and that in the end all of the state convicts will be used upon the public works."
