## THREE MORE SHIPS ENTER

THE TEXAS, MINNEAPOLIS AND TOPEKA JOIN THE FLEET IN PENSACOLA.

Three more vessels of the combined fleet reached here yesterday morning. They were the Texas, flagship of the Coast squadron; Minneapolis, flagship of the Training squadron, and Topeka, attached to the latter fleet.

The vessels saluted the flagship and were in turn saluted by that vessel.

Rear Admiral Francis W. Dickins, formerly commandant of the Pensacola navy yard, is on the Texas and is in command of the squadron. Rear Admiral Royal B. Bradford is on his flagship, the Minneapolis, as commanding officer of the Training fleet.

These vessels will remain here until the conclusion of the target practice, at least that is the intention at the present time.

There are now four rear admirals of the navy on board vessels in the bay. They are Rear Admiral Evans, commander in chief; Rear Admiral Davis, second in command, and Rear Admirals Bradford and Dickins.

## PROMINENT NAVAL OFFICER IN CITY

REAR ADMIRAL HIGGINSON, OF WASHINGTON, WILL VISIT FRIENDS.

Among the most prominent of the naval officers who are now in the city, is Rear Admiral Francis J. Higginson, who reached here Thursday night on a visit of several days to friends and acquaintances. The admiral is accompanied by Col. J. B. Thompson, a retired naval officer.

The two distinguished officers came from Tampa, where they recently went on Colonel Thompson's magnificent houseboat. They left the vessel at that point and took the train to come to Pensacola. The length of their stay has not yet been definitely decided.

The many friends of Admiral Higginson were much pleased to greet him, inasmuch as he had not been seen here in more than two years, when he first came to the port in command of the North Atlantic fleet.

## WILL RESIST MOBILIZATION

PROCLAMATION ISSUED IN POLAND DEMANDING THAT MILITARY RESERVES IGNORE THE CALL.

Vienna, March 31.—A dispatch from Lemberg, Galicia says the social democratic party has issued a proclamation throughout Poland, demanding that military reserve men resist mobilization. The proclamation says "Ignore the call to arms as far as possible, yielding only to superior forces; he who voluntarily enters military service will be branded as a traitor."

## SHE WAS MISTAKEN.

The Story of a Woman Who Thought She Told the Truth.

"If you ask me whether we lawyers ever encourage, aid and abet untruthfulness," said an elderly attorney at a dinner recently, "I can only ask as a reply: 'Does any one know what truth is? Does any man really know when he is telling it?' I had a rather curious case once a few years ago. I won't say whether it was a murder or a divorce, but the clearing of my client, the defendant, depended entirely on his ability to prove that when he walked down a certain corridor of a certain summer hotel he was accompanied by two persons. It happened that he was seen by the housekeeper of the hotel, a woman of more than ordinary intelligence, and she insisted that there were three in the party and not simply two, as the prosecution claimed. It was impossible to shake her testimony, and we carried the day. The housekeeper died a year or so later. I heard it through her priest. He commented on the fact that she had always taken great satisfaction in the thought that her testimony cleared my client. She was, he said, and he spoke from a confessor's knowledge, one of the most truthful persons he had ever met. I told my client what the priest said the next time we met. He smiled.  
"She was lying all the while," he said. 'She didn't see three of us, because there were only two.'—Washington Post.
