STEAMER DAVID WAS UNINJURED

VESSEL THAT WENT ASHORE NEAR MIAMI WAS BOUND FOR PENSACOLA.

A Miami dispatch in the Jacksonville Sun says: "The steamer ashore south of the house of refuge proved to be a British-built but an American registered vessel, David, from Norfolk to Pensacola, with 1,000 tons of coal for the navy yard. The steamer was pulled off at 11 o'clock last night by the Martha Helen and proceeded on the voyage uninjured. The steamer is owned by the American Fruit Company. The tug owners will libel the vessel for salvage."

"British Vice Consul Sudlow, who left to-day for Fernandina on a business trip, received a telegram early to-day from Miami which says that the steamer David, reported ashore near Miami, has been floated. "The first advice received was to the effect that the David was an English tramp steamer. The telegram received to-day says that the David is an American tramp steamer owned by the Donald Steamship Company of New York city.

"The David went aground at 6:15 o'clock Monday morning off the house of refuge, near the Miami coast. The steam tug Martha Helen succeeded at 4:15 o'clock Monday afternoon, in pulling off the steamship David from her perilous position.

"The David was able to proceed to her destination, which is reported to be Pensacola."

The batteries were Hannah and Rogers for the High School and Turtle and O'Brien for the Business College. The umpire was Will Cator and the time 1 hour and 15 minutes.

WRESTLING MATCH IS ARRANGED

"KID" PHILLIPS, OF PHILADELPHIA, AND ED. TAYLOR TO GO ON THE MAT SOON.

Articles of agreement for a wrestling match between Ed. Taylor, of this city, and "Kid" Phillips of Philadelphia, were signed last night at the Journal office, when the manager of the latter athlete met with Taylor and his manager and signed a contract to wrestle in Pensacola during the month of May, the date not yet being decided upon.

The match will be for 50 per cent of the gross receipts, in addition to a side bet of \$250. It will occur in the opera house, at 165 pounds, and in case either fails to come up to the requirements as to weight \$50 is to be forfeited.

The money is to be posted with the stake holder on or before May 20, and a referee is to be selected no later than three days before the match.

Cal. Harris, of New York, who came here to train "Kid" Eaton, for the match with Taylor, signed the agreement for Phillips, who is now in Philadelphia, and the latter will soon arrive here. Eaton had agreed to wrestle Taylor again for a big purse, but when Harris reached here he found the "Kid" out of condition, and would not allow him to go on the mat with Taylor, but arranged for the latter to go on with Phillips, of Philadelphia.

New York Cotton Market.
New York, May 17.—The cotton market opened steady, unchanged to three points lower, which was fully as good as due on the cables and a generally favorable weather map. There seemed active bull support, however, and with yesterday's sellers covering in fear of manipulation, prices here quietly advanced to about 13 points over last night's level, following which the execution of selling orders from Liverpool which some thought originated within local bulls, caused a second reaction and the market in the middle of the morning was nervous and irregular, at about unchanged to two points lower.
