THE ADVANCE IN PRICE OF SPIRITS.

The Savannah News of Sunday says: Prices in the naval stores market were given another boost skyward yesterday, and everything cleaned up at the closing figures or better. The spirits of turpentine market opened firm and unchanged at 65½c, with sales of 369 casks, and closed firm at 66½c bid, with further sales of 9 casks. In the trading after the close everything was cleaned up at the advance price. The receipts were 750 casks, and the shipments, 799. New York was quoted quiet, at 69½c, a jump of 1c over the close of the previous day, and London advanced flat to 52—.

The rosin market opened firm at advances on all grades from 5@15c, with sales of 2,305 barrels. The close was firm and unchanged, and without additional sales. In the late trading, however, there was another substantial advance on all grades, some sales being made at 12½c up on W. W. 25c on W. G., 15c on N., 10c on M., K., L., and 5c on the lower grades, while others were at an advance of 10c on W. W. 15c on W. G., N., M., 10c on K., L., H. and 5c on G. and below. The receipts were 2,128 barrels, and the shipments, 1,428. The New York market was quoted firm at \$3.70.

New York, May 22.—The cotton market opened strong 10@15 points on active covering and fresh buying for long account, following much firmer cables than expected both as to spots and futures, and reports of further rains in portions of the belt which have recently complained of too much moisture. There was active realizing by the bull leaders tending to check the advance around the initial figures, but the market continued very feverish during the early session with prices holding well up to or a little over the opening figures and trading continued active.
