A dispatch from Akron, O., contains the following: Mabel W. Truff, alias Minnie Bell Shirley a young woman of beauty and refinement, who comes of an excellent family at Watertown, Fla., was sentenced to serve one year in the penitentiary here for grand larceny. Last spring she stole diamonds worth \$1,000 from Minnie Christian and fled. She was caught in Buffalo and brought back.

Local officials who investigated her past, found that not many years ago Mabel was a leader in the society of her native town in Florida, taught in the Sunday school and sang in the village choir. When the Spanish-American war broke out she volunteered as a Red Cross nurse and served in Cuba, being wounded in the hand while caring for soldiers on the field of El Caney.
