THE BOARD OF SAFETY HELD ITS FIRST MEETING

WALKER INGRAHAM CHOSEN AS CHAIRMAN—MESSRS. MCGAUGHEY AND OLIVER SWORN INTO OFFICE.

The Board of Public Safety met last night. It was the first session of the board since the appointment of the new members.

A letter was read from J. Geo. White, Jr., former chief of the fire department, in which he thanked the board for many courtesies extended, and wished Chief Bicker the best of success.

A number of communications were then read after which the old board retired, Messrs. Gonzalez and Johnson being replaced by Messrs. Oliver and McGaughey.

Mr. White, on behalf of the old board, thanked the officials for the very pleasant association, and the manner in which the business of the city had been transacted.

The new board then assumed charge of the affairs of the city so far as their jurisdiction extended. Clerk Bernard administered the oath of office to Messrs. Oliver and McGaughey, after which Walker Ingraham was unanimously elected chairman of the board.

A vote of thanks was extended to the members of the old board for faithful service, after which the regular order of business was taken up. The first matter to come up was charges against Driver Dillon Tounar, of the hook and ladder truck, for fast driving.

He made a statement, and was found guilty, but it was the sense of the board that the fireman was endeavoring to reach the fire at the earliest possible moment, and in consequence he was only reprimanded.

The fact that the fireman had been suspended for fast driving brought on a discussion. Mr. McGaughey wished to know what was considered fast driving. In asking this question he said that he had noticed upon more than one occasion that trucks in going to a fire appeared to be in a funeral procession.

He was informed that by a former ruling of the board the trucks could not go faster than a trot on Palafox street. It is probable, judging from the comment, that the new board will look into this matter further, as it has been the cause of considerable comment.

The monthly report of the chief of the fire department was read and filed. This included an accident to No. 2. Driver Hall was exonerated of any blame. It was ordered that the extra patrol wagon be placed in use until repairs could be made to the truck.

John M. Gagnet entered a complaint against the saloon conducted by G. Guardia, at the corner of Barcelona and Zaragoza, stating that it was a public nuisance; that music and dancing was conducted there until late hours, preventing those residing in the neighborhood from occupying seats on their front galleries. The matter was referred to the mayor.

Applications for positions in the fire department were read from A. E. Graham, R. O. O'Donovan and E. H. Yiestra. All were referred to the chief.

D'Alambert's Assistant. The board then heard the application of H. T. D'Alambert, read. He applied for the position of assistant chief of the fire department. He was the only applicant, and upon receiving the approval of Chief Bicker was unanimously elected to the position.

The resignation of Jos. M. LeBaron as fireman, was read and accepted.

The Feed Bills. The bids for feed of the city stock then came up for discussion. A bid was submitted by A. McDonough and Moyer, quoting hay and oats at a certain price. Mayor Bliss at this juncture arose and produced a bill submitted by Mr. Moyer against the city in which hay was charged at \$1.00 per bale, while the contract with the city was about 60 cents.

The mayor said that bales of hay averaged 80 to 120 pounds, but that in every instance where a bale had been purchased in any department it had been charged at \$1.00, although the contract was for only about 75 or 80 cents.

This brought on a discussion, which finally terminated by the board passing a resolution that hereafter the successful bidder must furnish on his bill the number of pounds and the price, and that the clerk notify all merchants that bids would be received for feeding stock on certain dates.

It was decided to meet ever second and fourth Wednesdays at 8 o'clock.

MERCHANT TRIES TO KILL HIMSELF

CHAS. G. SQUIRES, OF NEW YORK, SHOT HIMSELF IN A CHICAGO HOTEL.

By Associated Press. Chicago, June 13.—The Tribune today says: Assigning no motive for the act, Charles G. Squires, of New York, has shot himself in the head at the Auditorium annex. It is said at the hotel where the wounded man remains, that his recovery is doubtful.

Squires went methodically about his attempt at suicide. He has been a frequent guest at the hotel and all the managers, clerks and employes know him well. He bade all of them good-bye without giving any inkling of his intention to take his life.

He hired a cab, rode a short distance, left the vehicle in Wabash avenue, bought a fishing rod and a revolver and was driven back to the hotel. It is supposed the rod was purchased to divert suspicion.

Going to his room Squires left the door wide open, walked to a mirror and placing the revolver at his head, pulled the trigger. A chambermaid heard the report, and rushing into the room found Squires lying on the floor.

Dr. D. J. Hammond, the house physician, was called in and pronounced a dangerous wound. Squires was unconscious. He left no note or anything to indicate his motive for attempting to take his life.
