OPENING DAY OF CRIMINAL COURT

Number of Cases Disposed of on Pleas of Guilty—Court Adjourned Until Thursday Morning. The Escambia county criminal court of record convened yesterday, Judge E. D. Beggs presiding. There were 56 cases on the docket but no cases were tried, the session being devoted to accepting pleas of guilty and setting the various cases for trial. The most important cases on the docket at this term of the court are those of J. B. Vaughn, who killed a young man at Century while shooting at another, and that of B. H. Burton, charged with embezzlement of funds of the county. These cases did not come up yesterday and there appears to be some question as to whether or not they will reach trial at this term of court. Court adjourned at 5:30 until Thursday morning when the jury cases will be taken up. The following entered pleas of guilty yesterday and were sentenced as indicated: J. S. William Doyle, carrying concealed weapons, \$100 or three months in jail. Frank Finley, carrying concealed weapons, \$100 or three months in jail. C. B. Price, assault and battery, \$5 and costs or 30 days in jail. Squire Moberly, placing obstructions on a railway track, 6 months in the state penitentiary. DEATH MONDAY OF T. J. HURLEY WELL KNOWN YOUNG MAN EXPIRED OF CONSUMPTION AFTER LONG ILLNESS.

Timothy J. Hurley, for the past six years a resident of Pensacola, latterly employed as auditor of the Yellow River Railroad, expired yesterday afternoon at the residence of Robert H. Langford, 114 W. Garden street, where he had made his home, the cause of death being consumption. Deceased was 24 years of age. He leaves a wife, nee Miss Anita Langford, and baby daughter in this city, and a father, mother, two sisters and an aunt in Ireland, of which country he was a native. He was also a distant relative of J. J. Sullivan of this city. Mr. Hurley was born in Castletownshend, County Cork, Ireland, and came to this country a little over six years ago, coming at once to Pensacola where he secured employment in the roadmaster's office of the L. & N., subsequently being promoted to a position in the office of the superintendent where he remained until appointed auditor of the Yellow River railroad. He had been in failing health for some months and about three months ago secured a leave of absence in order to attempt to regain his health. He returned to this city about three weeks ago and about a week later took to his bed, gradually growing weaker until the end came.

Funeral of Timothy J. Hurley will occur Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock from the residence, 114 W. Garden street and from St. Michael's church at 10:30. Interment in St. Michael's cemetery.
