Macclenny, July 25.—Henry M. Sweat, who was so badly stabbed and cut Friday last by Jesse Sweat, died yesterday morning.


Jesse Sweat is still at large, and it is said that he has been located in Charlestown county, Georgia, but it is thought that he has taken to the swamps.
