## EXPORTS FROM THE PORT FOR JULY

Reached a Total Valuation of Nearly a Million Dollars. Twenty-Nine Vessels Entered.

Exports from the port of Pensacola during the month of July, in valuation, reached a total of nearly one million dollars, a much better showing, so far as valuation is concerned, than that made one year ago.

Statistics compiled by custom house officials show that the exact valuation of shipments to foreign ports during this period was \$950,470. Twenty-nine vessels entered port, sixteen coming from foreign and thirteen from domestic ports. Twenty-seven vessels took out clearance papers, twenty-four going to foreign and three to domestic ports. The valuation of shipments and the countries to which they were made, are as follows:

## NEW INDUSTRIES FOR PAST WEEK

Industrial Development in South Continues on a Gigantic Scale.

Chattanooga, Aug. 2.—The list of new industries established in the Southern states during the past week authorized by The Tradesman, shows quite a variety of lines, some of which are novel to this section. The development of the South along industrial lines continues without abatement during the summer season, and it is worthy of note that heavy capitalization is on the increase. This week finds the state of Florida in the list with a two million dollar lumber and naval stores company. Oklahoma reports a million dollar mining and milling company, and Virginia two mining companies each capitalized at a half million dollars. In the cotton states a number of new mills and gins are reported. The heaviest development, however, appears to be in iron, coal and timber.

### Bond Election Proclamation.

Whereas, The Council of the City of Pensacola did on the 19th day of July, 1905, pass an ordinance, entitled: "An ordinance to provide for the issuance of Bonds of the City of Pensacola, Florida, under and by virtue of an Act of the Legislature of the State of Florida, entitled: An Act to authorize the City of Pensacola to issue negotiable bonds for municipal purposes, and provide for the payment thereof, approved May 12th, 1905," which said ordinance was approved by me on the 19th day of July, 1905:

Now, therefore, I, Chas. H. Bliss, Mayor of the City of Pensacola, pursuant to the provisions of said ordinance, do hereby call an election to be held in said City on the 22nd day of August, 1905, to determine whether, or not, the majority of the qualified electors of said City, qualified to vote, and voting, at said election shall approve the issuance of bonds for the purposes and amounts, or any of them, enumerated in said ordinance, to-wit:

For the purpose of purchasing, or constructing, waterworks the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary.  
For the purpose of constructing, or providing a system of sewerage and drainage the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary.  
For the purpose of paving and otherwise improving streets and public ways of the city the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

For the purpose of purchasing a site and or constructing, or providing a city hall building the sum of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) or so much thereof as may be necessary.  
For the purpose of purchasing a site and or constructing, or providing a Police Station and Jail Building the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

And notice is hereby given that pursuant to said ordinance the Council has duly elected the following Board of Bond Trustees, viz: F. C. Brent for the term of three years, L. Hilton Green for the term of two years, and J. M. Pfeiffer for the term of one year. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand, and caused the corporate seal of the City of Pensacola to be affixed, this 1st day of August, 1905.
