SUGGESTS BEARD FOR STATE SENATE

High Compliment Paid to Pensacolian, Who is Suggested as Senator Blount's Successor.

Roberts, Fla., Aug. 3.—The Fifth Sunday meeting was held at Powellton Baptist church, commencing on Friday night and closing Sunday evening. It rained almost continuously from beginning to close. On Sunday dinner was served in the church, as it was raining in torrents at the lunch hour.

It has been stated by some authorities, who assume to speak ex cathedra, that the present senator from our district, the Hon. W. A. Blount, will, under no circumstances, be a candidate for reelection to the position he now occupies. Mr. Blount has given general satisfaction, and he would doubtless succeed himself, should he so desire; but since he has decided he will not again be a candidate, it is not impertinent nor ill-timed to discuss the question as to who is the best Escambia man to succeed Hon. W. A. Blount. While doubtless there are many men in the city of Pensacola worthy to represent Escambia county in the upper branch of the state legislature, and while there is no intention to disregard the merits or claims of other public men, the writer suggests, that at the present time, there can be found in Escambia county, no man better qualified to represent his constituency in the state senate than Hon. John S. Beard, of Pensacola. His honesty is unquestioned; his loyalty to party unwavering; his steadfastness to principle unyielding, and his reputation for ability national.

He has done yeoman service for his party on many a political battlefield and his people owe it to him, as well as to themselves, to choose him to represent them in their state council at their next election.

As presidential elector on the Bryan ticket, Mr. Beard, on platforms throughout the great Northwest, electrified thousands and won over multitudes by his convincing logic and brilliant oratory.

Although radical, in differing from the wing of the party that nominated Judge Parker, and though firmly believing that in his nomination a grievous party error had been committed,

yet when the erminent sachem of Escopus had been selected at St. Louis as the standard bearer of his party in 1904, Mr. Beard did not, Ajax-like sulk in his tent, but put on his political armor and like the true knight that he is, led the crusade against the enemy of democracy, and won national fame as its most gallant defender.

Every one that knows Mr. Beard concedes his honesty and ability, and it would be a work of supererogation to cite attention to these qualifica-

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tions; but the writer has heard parties, who, admitting his moral and mental qualities, assert that he is unsafe, because, as they claim, he would imperil local interests by his antagonism to corporations, or opposition to capital.

Now this kind of talk is mere balderdash, for Mr. Beard is certainly endowed with common sense, and if so, would be guilty of nothing that would imperil his own interests by enacting legislation that would tend to frighten away capital from his community. While Mr. Beard would do nothing to hamper the legitimate interests of capital, he would, at the same time, certainly endeavor to prevent unjust exactions upon the people by the corporations. Now if this attitude be regarded as antagonistic to capital, then Mr. Beard may be regarded as persona non grata to corporate interests.

The writer will say nothing further now, for Mr. Beard may refuse to be a candidate for the position above alluded to; but it is sufficient to state that if Escambia county should decide to choose him to represent her in the senate, she will honor herself as well as him.
