NEW INDUSTRIES FOR PAST WEEK

Industrial Development in South Continues on a Gigantic Scale.

Chattanooga, Tenn., Aug. 4.—For the week ending August 2 The Tradesman reports one hundred and thirty-four new industrial organizations in the South. The remarkable development which has been going on, during what might be considered a dull season, is without precedent, and nowhere in the country has there been shown such activity as continues throughout the South. This in spite of the fact that there have been some drawbacks, and what might be considered reasons for calling a halt.

The new organizations, as noted in the list following, show that the developments are not confined to any particular section, but that the entire South is sharing in the continued prosperity. The list shows by cities and states just what is going on, and it requires little or no argument, beyond the clear statement of facts, to prove that the South is rapidly approaching the time when it will be the industrial as well as the manufacturing center of the country.

ALBERT LEROY SENTENCED TO SERVE NINE MONTHS.

Albert LeRoy, the white man who was taken into custody two weeks since upon the charge of robbing his employer, a Greek restaurant man of \$40, entered a plea of guilty to the charge before Judge Beggs Wednesday.

The court gave him a sentence of nine months at hard labor in the penitentiary, the charge being grand larceny. LeRoy was formerly a blue jacket, and has been here since the departure of the fleet.
