NAVAL STORES MEN FORM FACTORAGE FIRM.

The Southern States Naval Stores Company is the name of a new factorage company for which application for charter will be filed in the supreme court Tuesday says the Savannah News. The petition for incorporation will be filed by Messrs. Olin T. McIntosh and David T. Furr, through their attorney, Mr. George C. Heyward, Jr.

The new company will start out with a capital stock of \$50,000, but will ask the right to increase this sum to not more than \$100,000, and will have its headquarters at Savannah, but seeks the privilege of establishing branch offices and agents in other places in Georgia and elsewhere. The business to be conducted is that of a general naval stores, timber, timber products, merchandise, hardware and all other articles of personal property. Stripped of all technical details the concern proposes to carry on a business similar to that of the naval stores factorage firms already established.

Both of the petitioners are well and most favorably known in the local naval stores business. Mr. McIntosh has for some years been connected with Messrs. Chesnut & O'Neill, in charge of the sales department of the business while Mr. Furr has held a responsible place with Mr. James A. Farie, Jr., a prominent naval stores man. In addition to these gentlemen a number of naval stores producers are interested in the company. The offices of the concern will be in room No. 501 Germania Bank building. They will be opened September 1. Active business will be begun October 1.
