A Small Delinquent City Tax List This Year.

The Journal publishes the list of delinquent city taxes for 1904 this morning and it is one of the smallest lists which has ever been advertised. This demonstrates two things: first, that people have been in an unusually prosperous condition and have paid their taxes more promptly than usual this year; and second, that Tax Collectors Oerting and Whiting have been vigilant in the performance of their duties.

The call made by Governor Cox, of Tennessee, for a convention of the governors and commercial bodies of the South to be held for the discussion of a uniform quarantine and immigration law is exactly in line with public sentiment all over the South at this time. The convention should be held and the subject should be so forcefully presented to congress when that body meets in December that a uniform law of some kind will be enacted.

Business Confidence is Maintained.

If there is one thing above all others about the people of New Orleans, which stands out in bold relief just at this time, it is the splendid front which they put up while in the midst of the yellow fever scourge. For years on the first day of September, the Picayune and the Times-Democrat of that city have issued what is known as their annual trade editions, being a compilation of the business accomplishments of the preceding fiscal year and a statement of business prospects for the year that is just opening.

These annual trade editions have always been good, comprehensive, and complete, but never have any been issued which surpass the editions of the present year, 1905. From those trade editions of yesterday, no one would imagine that the greatest fight of three decades has been waged against the encroachments of the great tropic disease which has heretofore been the terror of all warm climates.

The outside world judges New Orleans, and will judge Pensacola, by the appearance of the newspapers published in those cities—there is no other way to do it.

A Tampa Comment on the Pensacola Cases.

In reference to the yellow fever cases in Pensacola, the Tampa Tribune says: With the proper quarantine restrictions, the Tribune sees no reason why the fever should not be confined to Pensacola, and stamped out there, almost as quickly and successfully as the one imported case in West Tampa was stamped out.

The unfortunate feature of the matter is that the fever should have again appeared in Florida. The mere fact that it is in the state will have a bad effect upon the entire state. Let it be hoped that Dr. Porter and his assistants will be as successful at Pensacola as they have been here. Meanwhile, it is interesting to ask what the doctors of Pensacola were doing while these four or five cases were developing in their city. Were they asleep or only ignorant?
