## TAMPA TIMES PAYS TRIBUTE TO ANDERSON

### The Pensacola Situation Is Safe In His Hands and No Fear of Fever's Spread Is Apprehended.

The Tampa Times pays the following deserved tribute to Dr. Anderson and Dr. Porter who are now in command of the fight being waged against yellow fever in this city:

The keenest interest is being manifested throughout the city in the fever situation at Pensacola. Everywhere throughout the city, expressions of confidence for our sister city are heard, and general regret is expressed at the untoward destiny that has visited upon the fair metropolis of West Florida the presence of the terrible scourge.

From all that can be learned here, it seems that Pensacola anything but courted the presence of the fever. The city is credited with having taken every possible precaution that any city could take, and probably because of the proximity of New Orleans, accomplished even more than is generally suspected in other portions of the state.

The greatest confidence is expressed by those who know him, in Dr. Anderson, agent of the state board of health at Pensacola. He is by no means a stranger to the citizens of Tampa, and all who have the pleasure of his acquaintance give him credit for being a conscientious, hard working physician, and an executive officer of the highest rank. The expression is heard that if Dr. Porter could have chosen an executive officer to assist him in his fight against the fever, he could have chosen none superior to the Pensacola physician.

General Regret Felt. General regret is expressed at the fact that fever has again made its appearance in the state. After the successful and brilliant manner in which the disease was stamped out in West Tampa, it was universally hoped that there would be no further danger of infection in the state.

It is noteworthy that in Pensacola, as in West Tampa, the disease made itself apparent among the foreign element in her population. In West Tampa it was an Italian, coming direct from New Orleans; in Pensacola, a party of Greeks first showed symptoms of the disease. This should teach the people of Florida a lesson that the proper inspection of the foreign population of the state in times of health as well as in time of disease, should never be neglected.

The fact that the name of Florida is being coupled with the presence of several cases of fever, will it is much feared, have a bad effect on the state at large. While Pensacola is really as far distant to all practical purposes, from Tampa and Jacksonville as are New Orleans and Mobile, yet the general travelling public will not recognize this fact and will think only of the fact that "fever is in Florida" and the whole state may suffer.

No Concealment. In Pensacola's case however, unlike New Orleans, there has been no attempt at concealment. The authorities there, as well as Dr. Porter, have observed the same general lines on publicity that obtained in the West Tampa case. If the fever should chance to get outside of the city, it will not be through any fault of the Pensacola authorities or the state board of health.

With regard to the standing of the situation in Pensacola, insofar as it affects Tampa, the general expression is that Tampa need have no more fear than when the fever was in New Orleans, occupying a position on the south end of the peninsula, with little or no trade connections with Pensacola, and with traffic from the city, Tampa stands aloof from the stricken town.

The distance between New Orleans and Pensacola is estimated at less than 200 miles, and in consequence, there is but little more danger to this city through the presence of infection in Pensacola than in New Orleans.

Dr. Porter's Generalship. If the disease is stamped out in Pensacola as it was in West Tampa, it will prove a victory that will redound to the credit of the state board of health, no less than to the city of Pensacola. While this is sad solace in times of stress and tribulation, at the same time, the people of Tampa can say to the citizens of Pensacola that they are in the hands of a general and physician who has won a marvelous victory for science in this city and unless some unforeseen obstacle intervenes, will do the same for Pensacola.

Tampa's Generous Spirit. Further than this, the Times takes it upon its own shoulders to say that should the citizens of Pensacola be visited with a prolonged siege of yellow fever, they will not need to call twice upon the metropolis of south Florida for assistance and for succor in the time of their distress.

## STORES CLOSING DR. GUITERAS ON NOW AT FIVE O'CLOCK CONDITIONS HERE

### Most of the Prominent Business Houses Cease Business at that Hour.

The closing of stores at 5 o'clock in the afternoon, as inaugurated Saturday afternoon by one of the leading establishments of the city, was followed yesterday with almost a general closing at that hour, and it is anticipated that this will continue indefinitely or until the fever is entirely eradicated, or all danger passed from the spread of the disease.

The business men of the city believe that the best means of preventing the spread of the disease is to carry out the suggestions of the authorities, and hence they cease business now at 5 o'clock, and all of the employees are allowed to depart to their homes. Business is not resuming the following day until 8 a. m.

Of course there are a few exceptions to this rule, as some merchants have not closed at the hour named, but it is possible they may yet decide to do so.

Shoppers should keep in memory the fact the stores close at 5 o'clock, and that purchases should be made before that hour.
