



CONFIDENCE IN BALDWIN CO. OIL FIELD

Company Desires to Drill Wells on Fish River Where Indications Are Good.

The following extracts from a letter to the Bay Minette Times from Jake Markstein, secretary of the Baldwin County Oil and Development Co., relative to the Baldwin County oil fields will prove particularly interesting in this section:

To the Editor of the Baldwin Times: Permit me space in your valuable paper to call to the attention of the people of Baldwin county, a few facts.

The Baldwin County Oil and Development Co., of Mobile, Ala., a regular company organized under the Laws of Arizona, for the purpose of developing Baldwin county for oil and other minerals, and of which I am secretary, have endeavored in the last three years to bore an oil well, but on account of not receiving financial assistance from those who directly to be benefited have not succeeded.

And I feel confident from indications at hand, that a well of 1,800 feet to 2,000 will meet with success, if bored by a practical man that understands boring in soft formations, such as we have in this section of the country.

Such a man I now have in view, he is practically an oil man in every sense and meaning of the word, and has unbounded confidence in oil being found, as he is willing to take a small sum in money, and the balance in our stock for his labor.

We now come forward and ask the citizens of Baldwin county to subscribe to our stock, and assist us to put a well down on Fish River; we have selected this section because indications are so promising; and then again if oil is found, it will prove beyond a doubt, one of the finest fields in the world, on account of the nearness to deep water, and its close proximity to the Gulf.

In all branches of trade and commerce some men attain prominence, we have consulted some of these, and now give you their views:

Dr. C. F. Z. Caracristi has spoken favorably of our field. It was Dr. Caracristi who predicted the Beaumont, Texas, field 11 years before it was developed.

State Geologist, Dr. Eugene A. Smith, who has visited our holdings, has said that borings made around Week's Bay would pass through same formation as encountered at Beaumont, Texas.
