HOLLOWAY WAS ACQUITTED OF CHARGE

Jury's Verdict in Famous Libel Case Declared Defendant Not Guilty.

The Gainesville Sun of last Sunday morning contains the following report of the Holloway-Sheats libel case: Verdict of Acquittal.

"We, the jury, find the defendant, W. M. Holloway, not guilty. So say we all. F. T. Baker, Foreman." This was the verdict of the jury which held the destinies of W. M. Holloway, State Superintendent of Public Instruction, in their hands. The verdict was returned at four minutes of midnight, and the suspense of a great many of Professor Holloway's friends was relieved, as it was feared at one time the jury would hang over Sunday. This suspense was not occasioned, however, on account of lack of confidence in the verdict, as the case was so clearly defined and the evidence introduced during the three days' trial so lacking of convicting strength that there was really no case. Of the four counts presented by order of the court, only one was accepted, and that was the charge published in an article by Professor Holloway in the Sun, on December 24, 1903, under the caption, "The Bookie Washington Affair."

The evidence being in, argument in the case was begun the middle of the afternoon. The argument was opened by Attorney J. M. Rivers, for the defense, who made a fine plea. He was followed by Attorney B. A. Thrasher, who made a good, strong talk for the state. Attorney Alex S. Clair-Abrams was the last speaker for the state in the afternoon, when court adjourned until half-past seven o'clock.

Court House Was Crowded. When court convened in the evening the court room was crowded with many of the best people in Gainesville, including a number of ladies. The argument was opened by Attorney Syd. L. Carter for the defense, who exercised his usual eloquence. He was followed by State's Attorney Calhoun, who, in a most forceful manner, endeavored to impress the jury in the interest of the prosecution. Attorney Frank Clark, for the defense, closed. Mr. Clark, as is well known, is one of the most eloquent speakers in the state, and he proceeded in a masterly way to tear the evidence and argument into shreds. He spoke an hour and twenty minutes and made every word count with the jury.

Judge Willis' Charge. The charge by His Honor Judge Willis to the jury was a most precise, clear and impartial one. This charge was completed at 10:30 and three minutes later the jury had filed into the jury room. The verdict was returned in one hour and fifteen minutes, only an instant before the clock was striking the hour of midnight.

The jury in the case were F. T. Baker, foreman; W. D. Tillman, John D. Polk, J. C. Baxley, J. M. Manning and M. E. Jolly.

History of the Case. Inasmuch as this famous case has been on the docket of the circuit for the past two years, having been postponed from time to time, it may be well to give a short synopsis:

During the campaign of 1904, W. N. Sheats, at that time the incumbent and Wm. M. Holloway, then County Superintendent of Schools of Alachua county, were candidates for the office of State Superintendent of Public Instruction. Mr. Sheats, upon the occasion of a state convention of county school superintendents and the General Educational Board in this city, invited Booker T. Washington, the famous negro educator, to make an address in Gainesville. Mr. Sheats alleged that a letter addressed to another party in this city, informing him of his action in the matter, came into possession of Mr. Holloway, after which Holloway caused an interpolation purposed to change the sense of the same, and to convey the impression that Mr. Sheats had invited Washington to speak in the auditorium of the school used for white people. What was purported to be a copy of this letter was furnished as campaign literature by Mr. Holloway and published in the Sun, along with other campaign matter. The result was that Mr. Sheats caused the arrest of Mr. Holloway upon a charge of criminal libel.

The above are the facts in the case in a nutshell, and the ground upon which the most closely and vigorously contested cases ever presented in this county, some of the best legal talent in the state being employed on both sides.

WEATHER DATA FOR COMING MONTH

What May Be Expected During December, as Shown by Records for Past Twenty-Six Years.

The following data, covering a period of 26 years, have been compiled from the weather bureau records at Pensacola, Fla., by Observer W. F. Reed. They are issued to show the conditions that have prevailed during the month of December for the above period of years, but must not be construed as a forecast of the weather conditions for the coming month: Temperature: Mean or normal temperature, 54 degrees. The warmest month was that of 1883, with an average of 62 degrees. The coldest month was that of 1903, with an average of 50 degrees. The highest temperature was 76 degrees on December 5, 1904. The earliest date on which first "killing" frost occurred in autumn, November 12th. Average date on which the first "killing" frost occurred in autumn, December 5. Average date on which last "killing" frost occurred in spring, February 23. The latest date on which last "killing" frost occurred in spring, April 6. Precipitation (rain or melted snow): Average for the month 4.11 inches. Average of days with .01 of an inch or more. The greatest monthly precipitation was 10.76 inches in 1881. The least monthly precipitation was 0.18 inches in 1889. The greatest amount of precipitation recorded in any 24 consecutive hours was 4.23 inches on December 13, 1885.

Clouds and Weather: Average number of clear days, 12; partly cloudy days, 9; cloudy days, 10. Wind: The prevailing winds have been from the north. The average hourly velocity of the wind is 5.5. The highest velocity of the wind was 60 miles from the southwest on December 28, 1901.

Ausley & Co.'s Cotton Letter. New York, Nov. 29.—European markets were up today about 6 points when our market opened, which caused a strong opening at 12 to 15 points above previous close, but immediately the bears began to hammer and prices began to sag and showed very little substantial report at any time during the day and a market that has no support after an advance of more than a cent per pound will naturally decline without much weight. This is a market that the big boys are having a bitter fight over and we would not advise anyone to get too heavily loaded on either side of it unless you have plenty of money to protect your contracts at least a cent per pound as the government estimate which comes out at noon on Tuesday is likely to cause a very wild market and people who have short margined accounts are likely to get closed out even though they may be right on the market.
