Full Text of Measure Recently Introduced Providing for the Institution.

Following is the full text of the bill recently introduced in congress by Mr. Wiley, of Alabama, providing for a national tuberculosis sanitarium to be established at Florala:

A bill to establish and maintain a national sanitarium for indigent consumptives.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the sum of one hundred thousand dollars, or so much thereof as the Attorney-General shall deem advisable, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the Treasury of the United States not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of erecting a national sanitarium for indigent persons of both races suffering from the disease called consumption, or tuberculosis of the lungs, including all persons in the Army and Navy of the United States, as well as those honorably discharged from such service who are likewise afflicted, and to aid in maintaining the inmates of the same; the building or buildings for said sanitarium to be erected at or near Florala, in the county of Covington, State of Alabama, upon such lands as the United States may acquire, sufficient for that purpose, by purchase, gift, or otherwise: Provided, That no money shall be paid out in the purchase of lands or in the erection of buildings under the provisions of this Act until the Attorney-General of the United States shall have reported to the Secretary of the Treasury, after proper investigation, that the titles to such lands are good and valid, and not until the deed to said property shall have been approved by the Attorney-General. The institution aforesaid is hereby authorized to receive donations and gifts of endowment from benevolent and charitable persons and from other sources.

Sec. 2. That the plans and specifications for the buildings to be submitted to, and be subject to the approval of, the Secretary of War; and the Secretary of the Treasury is authorized and directed to pay the money hereby appropriated in the manner hereinafter provided in this Act.

Sec. 3. That the Surgeon-General of the United States Army shall have the power to establish rules and regulations under which persons may be allowed to enter said sanitarium as patients and for medical treatment, and full and ample authority is hereby given to him to enforce such rules and regulations; that the control and management of the institution shall be vested in him, and he shall have power to appoint a superintendent, assistant superintendent, and all other officers and employees necessary for the care, protection and well-being of the inmates therein, and shall fix the compensation of such officers and employees. He shall also have authority to promulgate such rules and regulations for the government of the officials of said sanitarium as he may deem proper and necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act, and with this object in view may authorize the employment of persons to cultivate said lands, manufacture articles, and procure supplies for the institution, as may be best to make the same self-sustaining.

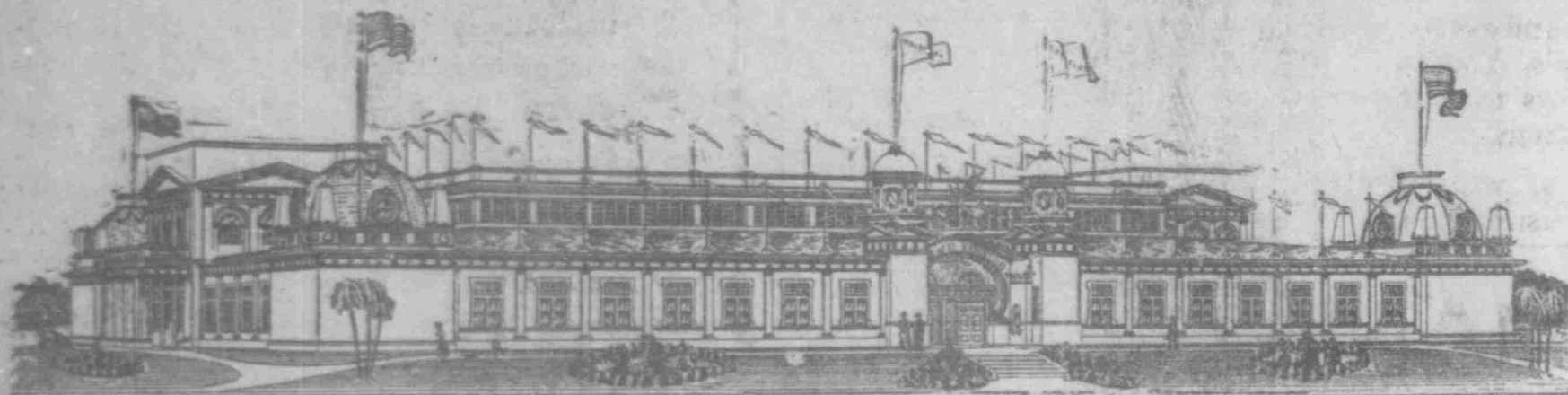

## JACKSONVILLE'S GREAT PURE FOOD AND INDUSTRIAL EXPOSITION NEXT MONTH



The Great Exposition Building.

Jacksonville, Fla., Dec. 13.—The date for the opening of the Manufacturers' Pure Food and Industrial Exposition is not far distant. With the elaborate and interesting program, the doors will be thrown open to the public on January 4th, and will not be closed until the 18th.

While hundreds of columns of articles have been published in the newspapers at home and abroad about the exposition, a short story outlining its plans, purposes and attractions will be read with interest by the general public.

It is important to know, to begin with, that the exposition company is

composed of well known Jacksonville business men—men of means and ability who have the industrial interests of the city at heart. The company will not spare expense in making the exposition an artistic as well as a material success.

Pure Food Exhibit. It was first proposed by the promoters to hold a Pure Food Show, on the order of those that have been so successfully held from time to time in important centers of the north and west. Working on this plan, the company met with the hearty co-operation of the large manufacturers of food stuffs of the country, many of them

being interested in the exposition through the local jobbers representing them in Florida. Many of these concerns took space and will spend large sums of money in preparing their exhibits and demonstrating their products. Some of them will reproduce the exhibits they have at the St. Louis and Lewis-Clark exhibitions.

General Exhibits. Enlarging upon their original plans, it was decided by the management of the exposition company to make a display of general industrial enterprises. This plan met with approval as evidenced by the fact that contracts have been closed with hundreds of

firms for space, in which will be displayed the most recent results in commercial products of all kinds. Notable in this display will be the latest models of automobiles, vehicles, machinery, planes, sewing machines, farming utensils, etc. Many of the local merchants will make handsome exhibits in the various lines of merchandise which they handle such as furniture, clothing, dry goods, hardware, etc.

Amusement Features. When it was definitely decided by the Jacksonville Carnival Association not to have a Gala Week this year, the manufacturers' Pure Food and In-

dustrial Exposition Company stepped into the breach and engaged many of the attractions with which the Carnival Association were negotiating. They have since engaged other high-class shows now playing in other parts of the country. Many of the shows and amusement features booked for the exposition were star attractions at the great exposition recently held in this country. A famous band containing over twenty-five people has been secured and will give two concerts daily during the exposition.

#### A Handsome Building.

The handsome building on the site of the old St. James Hotel, in the heart of the city, is now nearing completion. It covers an area of over 60,000 square feet and is striking in architectural effect.

Its immense glass-domed roof and hundreds of windows on the sides will give it perfect light advantages in the day, and thousands of electric lights will brilliantly illuminate it at night.

The beautifully arched main entrance between two imposing towers makes a pleasing effect. The interior will be divided up into hundreds of exhibition booths of various sizes, each exhibitor vying with the other in making the most artistic display. An immense band stand is at the middle of the west side of the building.

#### Large Attendance Expected.

The fact that the exposition is being held during the tourist season insures an attendance of thousands of visitors from all sections of the United States. Reduced railroad rates will be given from Florida points, special excursions will be arranged, and people from every section of Florida and adjoining states will be in attendance. Arrangements are being perfected by a number of secret and business organizations to hold meetings in Jacksonville during the exposition. This is a happy arrangement as it will give the members of such organizations a chance to visit Jacksonville, attend their meetings, see the city and the exposition at a minimum transportation rate.

A conservative prediction is that over fifty thousand people will attend the Manufacturers' Pure Food and Industrial Exposition.
