CONDITIONS ON THE ISTHMUS

BIRMINGHAM MAN, EMPLOYED BY COMMISSION, TALKS OF BIG PROJECT.

The Birmingham Ledger publishes the following interesting interview with a Birmingham man who has just returned from the Isthmus of Panama. H. Carrington, formerly assistant money order clerk of the Birmingham postoffice and now bookkeeper to the department of material and supplies of the Isthmian Canal Commission, is back in Birmingham upon a six weeks' leave of absence. Mr. Carrington talks interestingly of conditions on the Isthmus and of his hardships and pleasures of the men employed upon the government work there. He says that at present there is little active work in progress except at the Culebra cut, which will be the deepest cut of the entire canal, regardless of which model is ultimately adopted by the national government. He says that at other portions of the canal, with the exception of that part which lies or is to be along the Chagras river, that work is almost at a standstill at present. "The population of Panama," says Mr. Carrington, "is of all sorts. Most of the laborers are Jamaica negroes. One Alabama negro is usually estimated to be worth about four of the Jamaica product. Most of the natives of the country are crossed, more or
