# PENSACOLA IS THE OLDEST CITY

Notwithstanding that St. Augustine is supposed to bear This Distinction.

From ocean to ocean and from the Great Lakes to the Gulf, the children of generations long since past have been taught in the schools and at their mother's knee, that St. Augustine, Fla., is the oldest settlement on the North American continent. In fact, so persistently has this legend been repeated that it is accepted without question now as an historical fact. This, however, is not the only legend based upon the early settlement of our country which has been converted to the historian's convenience.

In its quaintness, with its narrow streets, its gates, its sea wall and its ancient cathedral, St. Augustine is undoubtedly the most unique city in North America, but it is not the oldest city on this continent. This distinction belongs to Pensacola, inasmuch as well authenticated records reveal the fact that Pensacola was first settled in 1559, or four years prior to the founding of St. Augustine. This first settlement, made at the instance of Charles V. of Spain, by a company of two hundred Spaniards under the leadership of Don Tristan De Luna, was, however, not called "Pensacola," but instead, was given the name Peuria d'Anchusi. Some thirty years prior to this settlement, or to be historically exact, in 1528, the Spanish explorer Panfilo De Narvaez, enroute from the peninsula of Florida to join the Spanish settlements in Mexico, landed on what is now called Santa Rosa Island, a beautiful strip of snow-white sand separating Pensacola bay from the open Gulf of Mexico—in reality, a sea wall of Nature's building, to protect the city of Pensacola, and the shipping laying at anchor in Pensacola bay, from the turbid billows of the great southern sea just beyond the city's gates.

It was on this island, and not on its present site, that Pensacola was first permanently founded.

Beautiful Santa Rosa Island! There, the bridegroom sea is coquetting with his bride, the Shore;

He decorates her sparkling brow with shells.

Then retires to see how fine she looks.

And, proud, runs back to kiss her.

The vicissitudes of Pensacola have been numerous and varied since its initial settlement. The first Pensacola was abandoned after two years;

the second was burned; the third, situated as it was on the unprotected sands of Santa Rosa Island, was destroyed by a hurricane; the fourth, situated in the neighborhood of the present site of Fort Barrancas, overlooking the harbor entrance into the gulf, was also abandoned; and the fourth was located on its present site.

Meanwhile, the government of Pensacola was changed by conquest and treaty during these vicissitudes of existence, no less than nine times—Spanish first; then French; Spanish a second time; French again; Spanish a third time; French again; then English; again Spanish; and finally, by the cession of Florida to the United States, in 1821, the government of Pensacola became stable, and for all time henceforth, it will remain under the protecting folds of Old Glory.

The faith of some have been the predominant religion of Pensacolians, and the feast days and periods of fasting peculiar to the Catholic church have always been closely observed here, hence, the celebration of the Roman festival of Mardi Gras—the season of mirth and folly immediately preceding the Lenten season of sackcloth and ashes—is peculiarly fitting to Pensacola.

Seven years ago, the first serious celebration of Mardi Gras in Pensacola was undertaken by the Pensacola Carnival Association, an organization so profoundly secret in its work that no member is permitted to divulge to the uninitiated outside world the identity of his brothers, therefore no one knows, save the appointed ones, where the funds come from for the creation of the magnificent pageants and other amusements which go to make Pensacola's Mardi Gras celebrations such carnivals of mirth and merrymaking.

For two days in every year, fun, frolic and frivolous amusements run riot in Pensacola.

The Luna phase which decrees the date of Mardi Gras occurs this year on February 26 and 27.


