WATER COMPANY QUESTION AWAIR

Mayor Bliss and Chairman Ingraham Discuss Matter at Length.

The Pensacola Water Company question was again aired by the members of the Board of Public Safety at the meeting of the body last night. The discussion was lengthy and at times animated, and culminated in the adoption of a resolution offered by Mayor Bliss to have a water pressure test within the next thirty days. The resolution provides that the tests shall be made on outlying mains.

The question was brought up by Chairman Ingraham of the board who resigned the chair temporarily and took the floor. He stated that he had read a statement in The Journal from Mayor Bliss anent the pressure test matter. Mr. Ingraham stated that he was opposed to a test at the time mentioned in the mayor's statement, and at the place selected for the tests, as he knew dead ends were there. Mr. Ingraham stated that he did not desire to appear as opposing water pressure tests but that he thought that every one should be treated fair and square in the matter, the water company, the city and citizens. He gave other minor reasons for opposing a test when first mentioned by the mayor. Chairman Ingraham said that he did not believe the chief executive possessed the authority to order water tests, thought that authority was vested in the board.

The mayor stated that he believed that he possessed the authority to had assumed. He would not argue the point. He said that the Pensacola Water Company had other weak points, besides the Baylen wharf. He wanted people to get what they paid for, and wanted the water company to show what pressure was being furnished. Favors tests and thinks board derelict in duty if tests are not ordered. The Pensacola Water Company, the mayor said must give the people what they are paying their money for. He did not desire to take advantage of the company, but would insist upon a compliance with the franchise the company has. He thought that a 100 pound pressure would be sufficient.

Mr. Ingraham stated that he was willing to make tests where continuous circuits existed, but not at dead ends.

Mr. Oliver stated that if the board knew that the company was not living up to the contract, it was the duty of the board to inform the council.

"But do we know it?" asked Mr. Ingraham.

"There is a way to find out," replied Mr. Oliver, "by making tests."

Other matters were considered by the board.

Chairman Ingraham presided with Mayor Bliss, Messrs. White, McGaughey and Oliver present.

On motion the minutes of the previous meeting were adopted as recorded.

The report of Fire Chief Bicker for March showed 7 alarms, total loss \$1,925; insurance \$2,250; average water pressure 79 pounds.

Chief of Police Schad made a verbal report concerning the meeting of the National Police Chiefs at Hot Springs which he attended. His report was in line with what he stated in The Journal yesterday. Chief Schad remarked: "That we of Pensacola are behind the times where police work is concerned." He referred to the finger print and Bertillon systems, and approved them.

In answers to an inquiry from Mr. McGaughey in reference to salaries paid in other cities, Chief Schad said that in nearly all cities the eight hour system is in vogue. The telephone system is another great feature in other cities. The chief stated that Little Rock, Ark. was about the only city that compared in system with Pensacola, in twelve hour watches. Montgomery, Nashville, Birmingham, New Orleans and other cities paid police officers better salaries than Pensacola.

During the course of his report Chief Schad touched upon the street car fender question. He said that the consensus of opinion among the chiefs was in favor of air brakes on street cars instead of fenders, claiming air brakes to be safer in all respects than the fender. Chief Schad said that in cities where the slightest suspicion that prisoners would try to escape that balls and chains were placed on them.

Mr. Oliver for the committee reported that the new hook and ladder seemed to be all that the specifications called for, and reported that the committee had received the apparatus. The report of the committee was received and adopted.

Mr. McGaughey reported that he believed that the city council would recommend the amount needed for repairs to the patrol wagon and two horse wagons.

Mr. Oliver reported that a pair of horses for the new hook and ladder had been purchased for \$500. He recommended that in future an appropriation be made to send a person to a horse market purchase horses. The animals reported purchased were reported sound. Received and action of committee approved.

Fire Chief Bicker stated that the department is in need of four more horses. Chairman Ingraham ruled that the committee on horses had plenary power in the premises. The resignation of B. H. Eaton as a member of the police department was accepted. R. Hogeboom and C.

On motion of Mr. McGaughey, Chairman Ingraham was requested to ascertain the status of the police-firemen-Pensacola Terminal Company. He wants to understand thoroughly the question of firemen and policemen riding free on cars.

The contract for furnishing feed was awarded to Marlon Curry & Co. The board then adjourned.
