# HARBOR, RIVER AND MARINE NEWS

## Shipping Transactions and Notes of Interest Along The Bay Front.

The river steamer J. P. Williams arrived yesterday from Milton and Blackwater with 68 bales of cotton for Marks & Gayle of this city. She also brought 202 barrels of naval stores.

The river steamer Vernon arrived yesterday from Parrish's landing and other points with 19 barrels of naval stores.

The steamer Tarpon, Capt. Barrow, arrived here yesterday morning from St. Andrews and other points with 700 barrels of naval stores. She broke one of her propeller shafts in leaving Apalachicola, but the accident did not prevent her from arriving here on schedule.

The lighter Escambia has arrived here from Florida Town with 353 barrels of naval stores.

One hundred and nine barrels of naval stores were unloaded yesterday from the schooner Viola at Jefferson street wharf.
