FOREIGN SHIPS CHANGE COLORS

NO LONGER A VIOLATION OF LAW FOR THEM TO CHANGE COLOR OF PAINT WHILE IN PORT.

A new treasury decision issued under the order of Secretary McAdoo and received by the local customs officials yesterday affects the status of foreign ships in port that may be painted another color before asking for clearance papers, and rescinds a section of a previous decision regarding the clearance of vessels of one of the nations at war. It reads as follows:
"Your attention is invited to T. D. 34,685 of Aug. 10, 1914, paragraph 5 of which specifies certain acts which will change the status of a merchant vessel to that of a war vessel.

Paraphrase 5, referred to in the order above, is as follows: "When a vessel of a belligerent power which has arrived as a merchant vessel alters or attempts to alter her status as a merchant vessel or there is reason to believe she intends to alter such status so as to become an auxiliary cruiser or armed vessel in any degree, you will immediately notify the department by wire. Any of the following acts will constitute such a change of status: (a) The placing in position or otherwise changing the location of guns which were on board the vessel at the time of her arrival; (b) so changing her appearance, color, rig, or equipment of a vessel as to render her suitable for some purpose of war; (c) the taking on board of guns, arms or ammunition under circumstances which in any way indicate the outfitting of the vessel for any purpose of war, or in aid of a military expedition."
