KNITTING DIRECTIONS.

Following are directions for knitting large children's sweaters. The sweaters are for the refugee children of France and other allied nations, and the work for knitting them is now available.

Use No. 3 needles.
Set up 60 stitches. Knit 2, purl 2 for 3 inches.

Knit plain for 14 inches, then add 40 stitches at each end for sleeves, and knit 18 ribs, then knit 40 stitches, bind off 20 stitches for neck, and knit back and forth on the last 60 stitches for 6 ribs. This leaves thread at inner edge.

Break thread and tie on at neck, opening for other shoulder. Knit back and forth for 6 ribs then add 20 stitches, and take up other 60 stitches and knit back and forth for 18 ribs. Then bind off 40 stitches, knit 60 stitches bind off 40 stitches.

Break thread and tie on at needle, knit back and forth for 14 inches, then purl 2, knit 2 for 3 inches, and bind off loosely.

Cuff: Use No. 2 needles. Tie thread on at bottom of sleeve. Take up 42 stitches for cuff, purl 2, knit 2, for 2 inches. Bind off loosely.

HELPING SOLDIERS.

Assistance Being Rendered Soldiers in Securing Bonuses.

Under a law recently passed by Congress every discharged soldier and sailor is entitled to a bonus of \$60.

There are certain formalities to go through in order to secure this bonus.

Mr. F. P. Phillips, who is in charge of the Home Service Department of the Local Red Cross Chapter, is rendering valuable assistance to soldiers in this connection.

Any soldier who desires assistance in securing his bonus should call on Mr. Phillips, who will gladly render him aid in making application for the bonus money.

ALL TAX DUE.

WASHINGTON, March 17.—Persons who neglected to pay the first installment of income taxes last Saturday have lost the installment payment privilege, and must now pay their entire tax upon demand of a revenue collector.

To avoid the penalty of 25 per cent in addition to the regular tax persons who failed to file returns Saturday may now submit belated returns with a sworn statement of the reason for delinquency. Without this the penalty will be imposed.

These policies, announced today by Internal Revenue Commissioner Roper, are to grant a degree of leniency to those who for some legitimate reason failed to file their returns when they were due. By law,

however, the installment payment privilege is removed from all failing to make payments on time and the internal revenue bureau has no authority to change this provision.

28 KNOWN DEAD, SCORES INJURED. TOLL OF CYCLONE.

NEW ORLEANS, March 17.—Twenty-eight dead and several scores injured was the toll taken by Sunday's tornado, which swept portions of Mississippi and Louisiana, according to reports from various sections of the two states reaching here tonight. Twenty-four persons were killed in Mississippi, four of them white. The path of the tornado included Delhi and Bayville, La., and Issaquena, Sharkey, Washington, Humphreys and Sunflower counties in Mississippi. Property damage is estimated at more than \$2,000,000.
