

### JULY 14th-1864 TO JULY 14th-1919.

Echoes come back today over a period of 55 years; then, as now, a period of unrest and war.

Possibly the reproduction of the following clipping from the Columbus Index, printed soon after the events recorded, may be of periodical interest

to a few survivors, and of historic value to those to come after us.

Among the troops sent out by Lowndes County, were four companies, E, H. I. and K, of the 6th Mississippi Cavalry Regiment, Mabry's Brigade, Forrest's Command.

I copied the account as follows, into a record book that contained memo-

randa of similar matter.

On this hot July day, the anniversary of a hotter day, I bring out the time stained record and recall the experiences of an 18 year old soldier.

In this battle Lowndes County had 46 of her sons on the list of killed and wounded.

### "List of Casualties."

In the 6th Mississippi Cavalry Regiment, in the Battle of Harrisburg, July 14th, 1864.

Field and Staff-Killed; Col. Isham Harrison, Lieut. Thomas M. Nelson. Co., C. Killed, Lieut. A. D. Clifton. Smith, severely in bowels. T. Worthy, slightly, leg. J. J. Calloway, slightly head.

Co., B. Killed-none, Wounded, Lieut. J. F. Clifton in breast, severely; Serg. Wm. Gresham, in leg, severely; Serg. Geo. Montgomery, leg amputated.

Co., C. Killed, Lieut. A. D. Clifton, wounded, Serg. D. Lemsford, finger, slightly. Missing, Sergt. Wallace; Privates McButt and J. Willborn.

Co., D. Killed, none; wounded Corp. T. H. Barton, thigh severely, Sgt. W. J. Swinnery, thigh mortally; Pvt. J. L. Thanick, neck slightly; J. Spinger, head and shoulder, mortally. J. Cathy, back, slightly; G. T. Goddard, hand slightly; W. T. Swinnery, face, slightly. Missing, Lieut. Austin and private Moore.

Co., E. Killed-Private Ellis; Wounded, Lieut. J. D. Turner, hip slightly. Sgt. S. H. Riley, foot and arm slightly. Sgt. A. Gee, arm slightly.

Co., F. Killed, none, wounded, Pvt. M. P. Davis, thigh severely, missing Privts. James Davis, John Davis, H. H. Allen, and James Hannal.

Co., G. Killed, none, wounded, H. H. Winstead, thigh, mortally, missing, Pvt. J. M. Sutton.

Co., H. Killed, Lieut. W. D. Carrington; Sergt. Wm. Humphries; and Corp. James Locke. Wounded, Sgt. Gid. D. Harris, arm severely; Sgt. W. H. Kennon, arm amputated. Sgt. L. C. Brothors, finger slightly; Pvt. Reub. Hardy, leg slightly; Sam Godby, arm and leg severely; John Roach, head slightly; Geo. Stewart, hip slightly; Jasper Floyd, finger slightly. Richard Millar, ankle slightly, Wm. Sein, hand slightly.

(Half of Company H. with 2 officers were off on detail guarding ammunition trains, leaving only 27 rank and file in battle. Of them, there were 13 killed and wounded, being nearly 50 per cent of those engaged. Gid D. Harris 1st. Sgt.)

Co., I. Killed, none, wounded, Lt. Wm. Bell, breast and thigh severely. Capt. C. A. Johnston, breast and hip, slightly. Sgt. B. Burks, leg slightly, Corp. W. Kidd, thigh severely; Pvt. J. M. Ashmore, wounded degree unknown. Co., K. Killed, Capt. Thos. G. Field; Privts. James McCown; Wm. Crawford, John Humphries; Wm. McClanahan, S. Kolb. Wounded, Lieut. T. N. Cobb, back severely, Corp. A. Gaston, hand slightly; Privts. Geo. Winfield, finger, slightly; M. Corban, breast slight; John McDonnell, hand severely; S. Stanley, thigh slightly; Robt. Shaefor, hand slightly; Chas. Cochram, arm severely; W. H. Bell, ankle severely; Sam Shidds, hip slightly; Early Hendricks, foot slightly. GID. D. HARRIS, 1st. SGT.
