### PETITION FOR PARDON.

The State of Mississippi, Lowndes County, To His Excellency, Gov. T. G. Bilbo, of the State of Mississippi. We, the undersigned citizens of Lowndes county, State of Mississippi, hereby petition to your excellency to grant one Tom King (col.) who is now serving an eight (8) year term in the State penitentiary, a pardon. The facts in brief are these: At the November term 1915 of the Circuit Court of Lowndes County, State of Mississippi, Tom King, a negro man of family, was charged, tried and convicted of assault with intent to kill and murder Mary King, his wife. It was the contention of the defendant that and while enraged over this fact, his wife had been unfaithful to him, he cut her severely with a knife. His wife is living, however, and we believe that the punishment inflicted has been severe enough. In view of the above facts, we the citizens of Lowndes County, request Your Excellency to grant Tom King a pardon and that he be restored to his liberty.
