The Mayor and City Council of the City of Columbus, Mississippi, met in regular session at the City Hall, its regular meeting place, on March 7, 1922, at 7:30 p. m., with the following members present: A. Y. Glover, Mayor; G. Y. Banks, C. C. Richardson, H. M. Beard, C. Wymen, T. W. Harris, J. W. Steen. Absent: none. The meeting was called to order by the Mayor, and thereupon the following ordinance was introduced by Councilman Harris, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilman Richardson.

**ORDINANCE NO. — AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NINETY-EIGHT THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$98,000) CITY OF COLUMBUS, MISSISSIPPI, REFUNDING BONDS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF REFUNDING AN OUTSTANDING BONDED INDEBTEDNESS OF SAID CITY REPRESENTED BY A LIKE AMOUNT OF RAILROAD AID BONDS WHEN THE SAME SHALL MATURE ON THE FIRST DAY OF APRIL, 1922, FIXING THE RATE OF INTEREST WHICH SAID REFUNDING BONDS SHALL BEAR, THEIR DENOMINATION, FORM, AND PLACE OF PAYMENT, AND PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF A SPECIAL TAX SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST ON SUCH BONDS.**

WHEREAS there have heretofore been issued and are outstanding ninety-eight thousand five per cent Refunding Railroad Aid Bonds of the City of Columbus, Mississippi, dated April 1, 1922, which mature and become payable on April 1, 1922, and

WHEREAS there is not now nor will there be in the City Treasury, funds available from taxes sufficient to pay said bonds on April 1, 1922.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE Mayor and City Council of the City of Columbus, Mississippi, under the power and authority conferred by Section 5 of chapter 246 of the General Laws of Mississippi, for the year 1920, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** In order to pay and retire such outstanding bonds when the same shall mature on April 1, 1922, there be issued and sold serial Refunding Railroad Aid Bonds of said City in the amount of Ninety-Eight Thousand Dollars (\$98,000), of the denomination of \$1,000 each, numbered from 1 to 98 inclusive, dated April 1, 1922, bearing interest at the rate of five and one-half per centum per annum, payable semi-annually April 1 and October 1, both principal and interest being payable at the Hanover National Bank in the City and State of New York.

**SECTION 2.** Said bonds shall mature and become payable in numerical order as follows: \$2,000 on April 1 in each of the years 1922 to 1926 both inclusive; \$5,000 on April 1 in each of the years 1927 to 1932 both inclusive; \$4,000 on April 1 in each of the years 1933 to 1947 both inclusive.

**SECTION 3.** Said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and by the Secretary of said City, with the seal of the municipality affixed thereto, and the coupons attached to said bonds shall bear the fac-simile signature of said Mayor and said Secretary.

**SECTION 4.** Said bonds shall be substantially the following form, to-wit:

**UNITED STATES OF AMERICA STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, COUNTY OF LOWNDES, CITY OF COLUMBUS, REFUNDING BOND.**

NO. \$1,000 The City of Columbus, in the County of Lowndes, State of Mississippi, for value received, hereby acknowledges itself indebted and promises to pay to bearer, on the first day of April, 19... one thousand dollars (\$1,000), together with interest thereon from the date hereof at the rate of five and one-half per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of April and October in each year, on presentation and surrender of the annexed interest coupons as they severally become due, both principal and interest being payable in lawful money of the United States of America, at the Hanover National Bank in the City and State of New York.

This bond is one of a series of bonds of like date and tenor, except as to maturity, aggregating ninety-eight thousand dollars (\$98,000), issued for the purpose of refunding a like amount of valid, outstanding railroad aid refunding bonds of said City, maturing April 1, 1922, under the authority of and in full compliance with the Constitution and statutes of the State of Mississippi, including chapter 246 of the Laws of 1920 and acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, and pursuant to ordinance and proceedings of the City of Columbus, duly and legally had and adopted.

It is hereby certified, recited and declared, that all acts, conditions and things required to exist, happen and be performed, precedent to and in the issuance of this bond, have existed, have happened and have been performed in due time, form and manner as required by law, and that the amount of this bond, together with the issue of which it forms a part, does not exceed any limit prescribed

by the Constitution or statutes of said State, and that provision has been made before the issuance of this bond, for the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said City of Columbus to provide for the payment of the principal and interest hereof. The full faith, credit and resources of the City of Columbus are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal and interest of this bond.

This bond is exempt from taxation within the State of Mississippi. IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Columbus, Mississippi, has caused this bond to be signed by the Mayor of said City and by the City Secretary, and the corporate seal of said City to be hereunto affixed, and the interest coupons hereto annexed to be executed with the fac-simile signatures of said Mayor and said Secretary, and this bond to be dated the first day of April, 1922.

**SECTION 5.** The coupons attached to said bonds shall be in substantially the following form:

NO. \$27.50 On the first day of April—October, 19... the City of Columbus, Mississippi, will pay to bearer, twenty-seven and 50-100 dollars (\$27.50) lawful money of the United States of America at the Hanover National Bank in the City and State of New York, being six months interest then due on its Refunding Bond dated April 1, 1922, No. —

**SECTION 6.** The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to register said bonds as issued, and to endorse thereon a certificate substantially as follows: "I, ... City Secretary of the City of Columbus, Mississippi, do hereby certify that the within bond has been duly registered by me pursuant to law in a book kept for that purpose in my office. Dated at Columbus, Mississippi, this ... day of ... 1922."

**SECTION 7.** Said bonds shall be lithographed or engraved or printed in two or more colors to prevent counterfeiting.

**SECTION 8.** For the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds as the same become due and payable, and to provide funds sufficient to pay the principal thereof at maturity, there shall be annually assessed, levied and collected upon all the taxable property of the City of Columbus, a special tax sufficient for said purpose, which shall annually be assessed, levied and collected at the same time and in the same manner as that in which other city taxes are assessed, levied and collected, so long as said bonds or any of them remain outstanding and unpaid.

**SECTION 9.** Said Refunding Bonds hereby authorized shall be advertised for sale at not less than par and accrued interest on sealed bids, and the Secretary is hereby directed to cause an advertisement of the sale of the bonds to be published two times in "The Bond Buyer," published in New York City, which notice shall describe the bonds, and shall specify that the bids must be made in writing, and enclosed in sealed envelopes addressed to the Mayor and City Council, Columbus, Mississippi, and endorsed, "Bid for New Refunding Railroad Aid Bonds," that each bid must be accompanied by a certified check drawn on some responsible Bank or Trust Company, for five per cent of the total amount of the bonds, payable to the order of the City Treasurer, the check of the successful bidder to be applied on the purchase price of the bonds when paid for, or to be forfeited in case of non-compliance with the terms of the bid, and the checks of the unsuccessful bidders to be returned, and that such bids will be received up to 7:30 o'clock p. m. on March 28, 1922, when they will be opened and considered, the city reserving the right to reject any and all bids, and that bidders shall be required to take up and pay for said bonds on said April 1, 1922, and will be furnished with the approving opinion of John C. Thomson, Esq., of New York City.

**SECTION 10.** All ordinances or parts of ordinance inconsistent herewith are, so far as inconsistent herewith, hereby repealed.

**SECTION 11.** There being no funds in the City Treasury applicable to the payment of the said bonds now to be refunded, and it being necessary that said refunding bonds be issued by April 1, 1922, in order to avoid a default in such payment, an emergency exists requiring that this ordinance take effect immediately, and this ordinance shall accordingly take effect from and after its passage.
