

# SEIBEL HELD ON SERIOUS CHARGE

FEDERAL AUTHORITIES CHARGE YOUNG GERMAN WITH VIOLATION OF MANN ACT.

## BIG CONVENTION ON JUNE 10

"Grown-in-Mississippi" Movement at Jackson Will Be Attended by More Than 2,000 Delegates Over State.

Carl Otto Seibel, the young German arrested a few days since on the charge of robbing the cash drawer in the store of Maj. Carl J. von Scuttler, several miles north of the city, afterwards skipping out with a young girl, has been turned over to the federal authorities on the charge of white slavery.

Affidavit against the young German was sworn out by Acting United States District Attorney J. W. George. Papers were at the county jail.

### Big Convention June 10.

More than 2,000 delegates from various cities and counties in Mississippi, it is expected, will attend the "Grown-in-Mississippi" convention to be held in Jackson on June 10 and 11.

Programs for this big event have been prepared and will be announced in a few days. A number of addresses by prominent men will be delivered. One of the features of the convention will be the exhibits of "Grown-in-Mississippi" products.

### Strengthens State Guard.

At a meeting held in Jackson recently a temporary organization to be known as the Mississippi National Guard Association was formed. The officers chosen were Adj. Gen. Eric C. Scates, president; Maj. George E. Hogaboom, vice-president, and Lieut. J. B. Carney, secretary.

The new organization is modeled on the order of the Army League of the United States, with a view to the promotion of a statewide interest in the welfare and strengthening of the state national guard.

### Gov. Brewer Visits College.

Gov. Earl Brewer, with other members of the board of trustees of the colleges and universities of Mississippi, went to Columbus May 27 to attend the annual meeting there of the trustees and inspect the industrial institute and college.

From Columbus the trustees went to Starkville to inspect the Agricultural and Mechanical College, and thence to the University of Mississippi.

### Many Automobiles Registered.

According to the registration records in the office of State Auditor Duncan L. Thompson, 759 automobiles have already been sold in Mississippi this year.

Registration of cars in 1914 shows that 6,284 automobiles were in the state on the first day of January.

### Druggists Meet June 8.

The thirteenth annual convention of the Mississippi Pharmaceutical Association which will be held in Jackson on June 8 and 9. Indications are that it will prove to be the largest and most successful from every viewpoint in the history of the organization.

### Reunion for Fighters.

Members of the famous Ratliff's battery will have a reunion and annual meeting here on Monday, June 7. The call for the event was issued by Mrs. Mary Andrews Croom, secretary. It has long been the custom of the survivors of this command to meet every year, recall incidents of the civil war and eulogize deceased comrades.

At a meeting of the Jackson Typographical Union held recently, L. V. Bries was chosen as delegate to the International Typographical Union meeting, to be held at Los Angeles in August.

# Home Town Helps

## GARDEN NEEDS MUCH WATER

Humble Tomato Can May Be Pressed Into Service If Hose Cannot Be Used.

Water is a great help in the garden, sometimes doubling the crop. If a hose cannot be used, it will save much work to sink a tomato can into the ground close beside some of the plants, a few holes having been made in the bottoms of the cans. None of the water poured into these cans will be wasted.

Without water, cultivation must be continuous, for it locks up the moisture already in the soil.

Of course the garden maker will want some berries, both strawberries and raspberries. Let him plant Chesapeake, William Belt and Abington and he will have strawberries to cover the usual season. By using the new variety Superb he can also have strawberries in the fall.

The best trees for the very small garden are those grown in dwarf form. They may never grow any higher than one's head and yet the fruit is quite as large as that produced by standard trees and very fine.

## FINE FRAME FOR DOORWAY

Trellis Work May Be Utilized in an Almost Endless Number of Interesting Ways.

Trellis may be used in a number of interesting ways, that most usually employed being the framing of a doorway. A window here and there that is desired to be screened may be successfully concealed by the placing of a light lattice against the house directly in front of the window.

growth of wistaria or rambler roses over this framework contributes an added detail of interest aside from the purpose it serves. An ingenious method of constructing such a lattice is to take thin strips of a fibrous wood such as ash and lace them in the manner of an open basket weave.

In fact, there is one writer who declares that if American farmers and gardeners knew how to make an intelligent use of waste material, they could save thousands of dollars a year in commercial fertilizer and reap much greater profits from their crops.

## MEANS MUCH TO NAVAL MEN

Ability to Communicate Through Water One of Most Recent Important Discoveries.

Several American battleships and submarines are now equipped with R. A. Fessenden's submarine wireless apparatus. This sends messages more than thirty miles under water, and the inventor expects that with experience it will be possible to improve the apparatus as to make it send and receive for several hundreds of miles.

The apparatus starts a metal plate vibrating so rapidly that it sends waves of sound through the water. Sound travels through water four times as rapidly as through air.

In an article in the American Magazine, Cleveland Moffett quotes Professor Fessenden as saying:

"You see the importance of these oscillators in naval warfare, for a battleship equipped with such instruments can talk to its own submarines while they are miles away and submerged and can actually direct their movements against an enemy's vessels."

## JUST WHAT IS BAD AIR?

Experts Prove That Overheated Rooms Without Proper Ventilation Produce Serious Physiological Defects.

Air is bad when it is overheated, when it contains an excess of moisture, and when it is chemically contaminated. This is the conclusion of the New York state commission on ventilation as summarized by Prof. C. E. A. Wislow, chairman.

The first indictment against bad air shows that an increase in temperature beyond the normal seventy degrees produces serious derangement of the vaso-motor mechanism of the body, resulting in a rise of temperature, increased pulse, and a lowered blood pressure, with a corresponding decrease in efficiency, both physical and mental. In addition to this, overheating conduces to an undesirable congestion of the mucous membranes of the nose, thus possibly paving the way for colds, sore throats, and attacks of various germ diseases.

The work of the commission also proves that chemical accumulations in the air as a result of stagnation bring about a decreased appetite for food, which in turn must have an unfavorable effect on the entire body. In the commission's experiments, the people living in fresh air ate 4 1/2 to 13 per cent more than those living in stagnant air.

"These experiments," says Professor Wislow, "indicate that fresh air is needed at all times and in all places. While we have changed our ideas as to what causes bad air, ventilation is just as essential to remove heat produced by human bodies as it was once thought to be to remove the carbon dioxide produced by human lungs, and it is now proved also to be essential for carrying away chemical products which exert a measurable effect upon the appetite for food. People who live and work in overheated and unventilated rooms are reducing their vitality and rendering themselves an easy prey to all sorts of diseases, such as tuberculosis, pneumonia, grippe, etc."
