## THE RESULT.

The election is now over, and we have the pleasing task assigned us, of announcing to the world that the cause of the people has triumphed over whiggery and the swindling banks. Attala stands forth in an attitude which declares that the rights of her free and patriotic citizens shall no longer be trampled upon by the foul misrepresentations of a party whose sole aim is to deceive and gull the people. She has sworn eternal hostility against every attempt to oppress her. She has burst asunder the bank manacles which have been riveted upon her for two years, and declared herself free, by casting a Democratic vote for every political office at the election just over.

Two years ago Attala elected a whig representative to the Legislature by two votes. She has now elected a Democratic representative by forty-seven votes; and she has given an increased vote for a Democratic Senator, and also for State officers and Representatives to Congress. It is unnecessary for us to advert to all the reasons which have wrought this mighty change in the political character of this county; and therefore we will only say, that the people have more generally consulted their own interest, by an abandonment of schemes of reckless speculation, and turned their attention to honest industry. We shall make no great parade about the triumph of principle which we have achieved, but will leave it to the calm reflection of those who have been so very busy in plotting schemes for our defeat. Will they reflect upon their conduct for one moment?

We say that the result of the election in this county is a triumph of principle, and principle alone. The Whig party certainly will confess, that they are now broken up as a party in this county, and will no longer contend that they are in the ascendancy. It has been contended ever since we have been a citizen of the county, that the Whigs had a large majority in the county, for which reason they refused to listen to an attempt to instruct our former Representative to resign, or conform to the wishes of a majority of his constituents. It is our opinion now as it was then, that the Democrats had a majority in the county, and that it was only claimed by the Bank party for the purpose of defeating an attempt to instruct our Bank Representative. Who was right then? Who is right now?
