GENERAL ORDERS—No. 6.
HEAD QUARTERS, }
JACKSON, MISS. June 19, 1838. }

THE Election for Brigadier General of the 2d Brigade of the 4th Division, held by order of Major General E. L. Acee, on the 23d and 24th of April last, was illegal.— Brigadier General James Carter will, there- fore, continue in office until the expiration of four years from the date of his commission. The elections held on the same days to Colonels Commandant of the 19th, 29th, and 33d Regiments, by order of Brigadier General James Carter, being also illegal, the Colone Commandant of said Regiments previous elected will continue in command for the period of four years from the day and date of their several commissions.

The election of Lieutenant Colonel Major of the 19th Regiment, held at the same time, was illegal, and the officers previous elected will continue in office for the term of four years from the date of their several commissions.

It is the desire of the Commander-in-Chief that all officers, elected to fill vacancies, con- tinue in office for the term of four years.

The 33d section of the 3d Title of the "Act to Regulate the Militia of this State," provides, that "It shall be the duty of every officer on receiving a resignation to forward the same, with the reasons assigned therefor, to the Adjutant General, who shall immedi- ately lay the same before the Commander-in- Chief; but no officer shall be deemed out of service until he has received notice of the acceptance of his resignation by the Com- mander-in-Chief." No resignation will be accepted unless it is shown that the officer offering to resign has performed distinguished services, or is incompetent.

The several Colonels Commandant, assisted by the Lieutenant Colonels and Majors, are ordered to lay off their respective Regiments into Battalions and Beats. The Beats will be numbered alphabetically, and laid off so that no beat shall contain less than forty-eight nor more than one hundred privates; and the Colonels Commandant are required to order elections and have their several regiments fully officered within three months from the date of this order.

"Whenever any company beat shall neglect or refuse to elect officers to its command, the Colonel or Commandant of the Regiment to which said company may belong, will nomi- nate a fit and proper person to take command of said company beat until such election shall be held; and such person so nominated shall, by warrant from under the hand of the Colonel or Commandant of the Regiment, be appointed Captain by brevet, and shall, during such brevet appointment, have and exercise all the powers and duties of Captain of the company, to the command of which he may be appointed, and shall be liable to all the penalties imposed by law upon Captains for refusal or neglect to discharge the duties of their office."

The Commander-in-Chief is now prepared to furnish volunteer Infantry companies with muskets and accoutrements complete, and expects to be prepared to furnish volunteer Rifle and Cavalry companies with rifles, swords, and pistols, in a few months. There are now no restrictions as to the number of Volunteer companies in the several Regiments; commissions will, therefore, be fur- nished to the officers of such companies, and arms delivered on the production of the certificate of the Colonel Commandant as re- quired by law.

The safety of the country requires an effi- cient organization of the Militia, and the Commander-in-Chief relies, confidently, on the zealous co-operation of every officer in effecting this desirable result.

RULES prescribed by the Bank Attorney, for the regulation of land titles to be mortgaged to the Mississippi Union Bank.

1st. Fifty years possession in the tenant or his ancestor.

2d. Patent from the United States.

3d. Spanish and English grants legally and fully executed.

4th. Order of survey from the Spanish Government confirmed by the commissioners acting by the authority of the United States.

5th. Deed from Indians confirmed by the President.

6th. Indian Reserves confirmed by the President.

7th. Receivers' receipt for money paid to the government for public lands, accompa- nied with an affidavit that the duplicate has not been transferred.

8th. When the certificates of the receiver of the payment of money is transferred, the transferee must furnish evidence that the transfer is according to the rules of the law.

9th. Where a purchaser, under the Govern- ment, has transferred his title by deed or otherwise, and has failed to transfer his cer- tificate, or in case the same cannot now be transferred in consequence of the death of the original purchaser, or loss of the certifi- cate, then a certificate of purchase from the receiver will be received as evidence.

10th. In connecting the chain of titles when no relinquishment of dower appears of record, the fact must be established by af- fidavit that the grantor was unmarried, or had no wife at the time of such conveyance, that could legally claim dower in the estate so conveyed.

11th. The title papers must be accompa- nied by the certificate of the clerk of the court of record of the county, that there is no mortgage, deed of trust, or other convey- ance operating as a lien on the estate, either real or personal, proposed to be mortgaged to the bank; or if any such exist state their amount and nature.

12th. Each subscriber must likewise ac- company his title papers with an affidavit, that there are no judgments against him in any of the courts of the State of Mississippi, or in the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Mississippi, operating as a lien on the estate proposed to be mortgaged to the bank, or if there should exist any judg- ment or judgments, state their character and amount.
