The Penitentiary Board of Control have recommended that Will Purvis be pardoned from the penitentiary.


Monroe county is to bridge the Bigbee north of Amory at a cost of \$15,775. It will be a draw bridge and will permit navigation.

## NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

To Ascertain the Will of the People Relative to the Issuance of Bonds to Construct Waterworks and a System of Sewerage in the City of Columbus, Mississippi.

In compliance with the requirements of the act of the Legislature of the State of Mississippi approved Feb. 2nd, 1898, this is to give notice, that there will be held, a special election at the Mayor's office in the city of Columbus (the usual place for holding municipal elections), on Tuesday the 29th day of November 1898, to ascertain the will of the people relative to the issuance of seventy thousand dollars bonds of the city; or so much thereof as may be necessary to construct a water works plant and a system of sewerage for said city. The election will be by ballot, none but qualified electors of the city can vote at said election. Those electors favoring the issuance of said bonds will deposit a ballot with the words written or printed thereon "For the issuance." Those opposed will deposit a ballot with the words written or printed thereon "Against the issuance." The balls will be opened at 9 o'clock a. m., and kept open until 6 o'clock p. m., and no longer. The said special election will be conducted and concluded in all respects, as other municipal elections held in said city.
