On the morning of the 20th of June Mr. John M. Matthes died at 7:30 o'clock, after a lingering illness of some four months. He was nearly 71 years old. He was a soldier from 61 to 65 and won many compliments from his commander for being a carrier that would carry a message to the most dangerous part of the line while the battle was going on. He had two horses shot from under him while performing his duty. He took an active part in the reconstruction period after the war, and was noted for his fearlessness in those most trying times. He was a good citizen in all that the word implies. Nobody ever doubted any statement he should make, and he was ready to help in any movement for the good of the community in which he lived. He leaves a widow, three sons and five daughters who did all that human hands could do for him in his last days. He was buried by the Masons of Okolona Lodge, of which he had been a member for many years. Thus another link, which binds the man to the long ago, has been severed. And we are reminded that as time rolls on we must each one step off the stage of action, and leave as a memorial only the kind words we have said and the good deeds we have done. He had belonged to the Methodist church for about half a century but the funeral was conducted by the Rev. Dr. Hunter of the Cumberland Presbyterian church, an old time friend to whom he was very much attached. The opening prayer and the benediction were by Bro. Brantley of the Methodist church.

CONCRETE WALK RESOLUTION

Whereas, the Council of the City of Okolona deems it necessary to construct certain sidewalks in the city; and,

Whereas, in the judgment of the City Council the general fund should not be used for the purpose of making said improvement, but same should be made by special tax to be levied on abutting property.

Therefore, Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Okolona, that the following special improvements is deemed necessary, and the City Council proposes to make said improvements as follows:

Concrete sidewalks shall be constructed along the following streets, avenues, lane and alleys, to-wit:

A concrete sidewalk four feet in width along the west side of Church street, from Brown st. to Monroe st.

Said sidewalks shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications on file with the City Clerk.

FIGHT THE BOLL WEEVIL!

THE ROBINSON CHAIN DRAG
Will Do the Work

Scientific, Practical, Economical and Indispensable

THE BOLL WEEVIL PROBLEM

The thing that confronts us most is how to grow cotton with the Boll Weevil.

The Robinson Chain Drag will do the work, to brush to the ground the weevil and the punctured squares, and its use in connection with rapid cultivation will prove to be of valuable service to the cotton grower.

THE DRAG DESCRIBED

The drag is a tempered spring steel rod that holds a light durable chain; the rod and chain being attached to the beam of the plow stock with a casting so as to be adjustable to the size of the plant at the time of plowing. The rod is placed at an angle to the beam, and as the plow proceeds down the row, the rod bends down the plant over towards the middle, between the rows, and the chain dropping from plant to plant, causes the weevil and infested squares to fall off into the middle of the row. The drag is reversible, as well as adjustable up and down, and can be used on either right or left side of the plow, below or above the beam.
