FUR USED IN MANY WAYS; USEFUL AFTERNOON GOWNS

FASHION is lavish, not to say reckless, in the use of furs this season. One wonders where all the skins come from, but there always seems to be enough to meet the demand that is pouring in from every department of woman's apparel. The supply is the affair of the furrier, who always seems to have something up his sleeve and produces pelts as a magician takes doves of rabbits out of a hat. Fur garments begin with the choker and scarf and progress through the wide scarf and short coat to long

lot much is expected of it; many furs are imitated with these skins. Two very new and lovely afternoon gowns are illustrated here. They belong to that particular type of gown of their class which may be worn with assurance to dinner or matinee or to any other functions where one might wish to be dressed with some distinction. As the mode develops we have afternoon gowns that are simple and chic and others far less simple, but not less chic. These latter are well represented by the models pictured, and

coats and big enveloping capes. And now we have the fur suit, usually consisting of a fur skirt, set on to a body of heavy crepe, making a one-piece dress, to be worn under a coat or cape, to match the skirt. The fur hat is making its entry to complete the winter costume. The short-haired, supple furs are used for suits and in millinery—including taupe and gray squirrel, baby caracul, broadtail, and the like. These short, smart coats are also worn with cloth skirts and the box coat is the favored model, made of many kinds of fur. Few women will care for a fur suit, but nearly everyone wants a neckpiece and no accessory is more useful or more becoming.

A group of neck pieces, in the illustration, includes the most popular of all scarfs—the silky, long-haired and soft fur that comes in several varieties and is wonderfully becoming. Nearly all the neckpieces for the coming winter are dark, but there are several colors to choose from. At the top of the group a scarf, with hat to match, is made of satin, covered with bands of monkey fur head.

will serve for many evening affairs as well as for daytime wear.

Nearly all fashionable fabrics are supple and have wonderful draping qualities. This allows designers to preserve simplicity of line in the silhouette while they indulge in endlessly novel draperies.

Something new and interesting in afternoon gowns is shown at the left of the picture, in which narrow val edging is featured. The model has a long, semi-fitted bodice with round neck, and a full, straight skirt, cut with points at the hem line. Diamond shaped motifs, in silk and wool embroidery, emphasize this unusual treatment of the skirt at the front and a medallion of embroidery serves the same purpose on the bodice. Odd undersleeves of net and lace extend the three-quarter length bodice sleeves to the hands, and here bands of folded georgette are tied about the wrists and fall in short ends.

Narrow bands of embroidery, draped sleeves and trailing sash ends of satin, bring the gown at the right up to the standard of dinner or matinee requirements. Minus the sash and sleeve

d by fancy braid. A great favorite appears at the right of the group—a two-skin stone marten scarf, exquisitely soft and in beautiful natural colors. A smart scarf of angora wool, with hat to match, offers itself as a becoming substitute for fur, to be worn with street or sports clothes.

When buying furs it is best to select the better grades, even if one must strain a point. These are the skins classed as "hard" and include marten, mink, sable, ermine and others that with care, last indefinitely. Some very lovely furs are "soft"—that is the hairs wear off more or less. Molehairs is one of those in which the garments are beautiful but not lasting. Rabbit is another, but is so inexpensive that

draping it is a simple affair and it occurs to one that they might both be removable, and thus widen the field of usefulness for this handsome model.

The simplest way in which to tone up a simple afternoon gown to make it serve for high occasion, is to make use of the rich brocaded ribbons or silks (some of them in metallic effects) that are made into long tassels. They are brought about the waist and simply knotted at one side or fastened with large and often gorgeous ornaments for the same use.
