Latest News by Telegraph.

Arrival of the Steamship Asia.

New York, Oct. 29.—The British and North American Royal Mail steamship Asia arrived at this port to-day from Liverpool with advices to the 13th and 14th inst.

Texas.—A telegram from Turin says: The Sardinia Chambers have passed a law providing for the annexation of Central Italy. Count Cavour made a speech, the general tenor of which was menacing to Austria.

It was reported that the French Army at Rome would be augmented to 60,000 men. The French Government was to supply Sardinia with large quantities of arms and ammunition.

The Paris Constitutional, a semi-official paper, in a recent article, complains of Sardinia, pointing to a general Congress for the settlement of the Italian question.

It was reported that Gen. Garibaldi received a wound at the battle of Volturno.

Naples.—Victor Emmanuel entered Naples on the 17th inst. Joseph Mazzini had refused to leave Naples. The Diplomatists at Gaeta had protested against the decree relative to Milano.

Gen. Guyon had re-occupied Viterbo. The vote on the question of annexation was to be taken in Sicily on the 21st of October.

China.—The Rebels attacked Shanghai on the 18th of August and were repulsed. Trade at Shanghai was stopped.

New York, Oct. 29.—The steamship Felton arrived off Cape Race yesterday, from Havre via Southampton, with advices to the 17th inst.

The latest accounts received from Naples say that the Neapolitan Princes have ordered a renewal of the attack on Garibaldi's troops.

It was asserted that great consternation had been caused in the Turin cabinet, in consequence of the Russian and Prussian Ambassadors protest against Sardinia's invasion of Naples.

Advices received from China say the allies attacked a Tartar camp, and the Chinese fled in great disorder. A grand attack on the Taku forts was to take place on the 15th of August.

WASH. NEWS, Oct. 29.—Governor Letcher, of Virginia, reports that four batteries will be at Richmond during the present week; and that nineteen companies of cavalry are reported to him as being organized.
