### RATE INCREASES GRANTED BY RAIL COMMISSION.

Jackson, Miss., Sept. 14.—The Mississippi railroad commission has granted the request of the common carrier for an increase of freight rates on intrastate shipments similar to that granted by the Interstate Commerce Commission for interstate rates.

Action by the commission was taken late Monday afternoon and the formal order which is now being granted by the attorney general's office will be placed on the minutes Thursday at a special meeting to be held at that time.

The commission was unanimous on the subject, having agreed that the increases sought are in harmony with the general policy towards the common carriers, as outlined by the Interstate Commerce Commission, and that resistance to the upward revision by any state governing body will be useless.
