## TROOPS POISONED

The Fiendish Filipinos Are Using Brass-Tipped Bullets in Their Warfare.

OTIS TO RENEW ACTIVE OPERATIONS.

The Proclamation Issued by the Philippine Commission in Accordance With Instructions.

Seven Companies of the Eighteenth Regiment Meet 400 Rebel Riflemen—Fifty of the Latter Were Killed and 100 Wounded.

WASHINGTON, March 24.—It is the understanding of the officials that within 48 hours Gen. Otis will recommence active operations against the Filipinos. By following up the proclamation of the commission in this manner the officials believe they will impress upon the Filipinos the determination of the United States to end the insurrection and the hopelessness of further resistance.

Reports received at the war department from the medical officers serving with troops in the Philippines show that Aguinaldo's army is using brass-tipped bullets. Several American soldiers have been wounded by the poisonous projectiles, and in consequence the wounds are more difficult to heal than those caused by the ordinary bullet. Of course, the authorities can do nothing to prevent the insurgents using any kind of bullets they see fit. They have no government to which an appeal can be made. Their action in this respect, officials say, is another indication of their utter unfitness for self government.

It is officially stated at the state department that the proclamation just issued by the Philippine commission is in accordance with the instructions given President Schurman and his associates.

MANILA, March 24.—Details of the fighting at Holo on March 16 show that 400 rebel riflemen from Pania were met by seven companies of the 18th United States infantry and a battalion of the Tennessee volunteers. As supports these troops had three twin Hotchkiss guns under Gen. Miller, north of Jaro, across the river.

The Americans were met with a heavy fire. One man was killed and 15 were wounded of the 18th regiment, and there were several cases of sunstroke. Gen. Miller estimates that 50 rebels were killed and 100 wounded.

Wages to Be Advanced.

PITTSBURGH, Pa., March 24.—The engineers of the Jones & Laughlin Steel Co.'s mills have been notified that their wages would be advanced 10 per cent. April 1. A representative of the firm is responsible for the statement that on the same date there will be a general advance in all departments, affecting fully 5,000 men. The same official announced that the company contemplates the erection of a number of new mills, but would not state what class of mills the are to be.

A Huge Block of Marble.

ATLANTA, Ga., March 24.—Prof. Yeates, of the geographical survey, has been advised that a marble block weighing something over 100,000 pounds, has been successfully removed from a quarry at Marble Hill, Ga., and started on its way to New York. The marble is almost pure white and measures 27 feet 3 inches long by 4 feet 3 inches wide, and is believed to be the largest block quarried in modern times.

## THE PEACE CELEBRATION.

Committee of Washington Citizens Request That Adm. Dewey Be Summoned to Attend the Jubilee in May.

WASHINGTON, March 24.—A committee of citizens who are arranging for a peace jubilee in Washington next May called at the navy department Wednesday to secure, if possible, the attendance of Adm. Dewey on that occasion. Their application was made directly to Secretary Long and they stated the proposed peace celebration will be exceptional in the fact that it is to be practically national in character and this would justify the request that the hero of Manila be summoned to attend. The secretary listened with interest to what the committee had to say and replied that he would confer with the president on the subject.

## MINING LEGISLATION.

Bill Passes the Arkansas House Providing That All Coal Mined in the State Shall Be Weighed Before Screened.

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., March 24.—The bill providing that all coal mined in Arkansas shall be weighed before screened passed the house by a unanimous vote Wednesday. The bill makes it a fineable offense for any coal operator to neglect or refuse to comply with the provisions of the measure. Protests were filed by every coal dealer in Little Rock, Pine Bluff, Ft. Smith and other cities, but these were ignored by the legislature. The bill was introduced in behalf of the miners who are now on strike.

## Mother and Two Children Fatally Burned.

UNIONTOWNS, Pa., March 24.—Mrs. Frank Wildak, of Oliver, used kerosene in kindling a fire Thursday, and as a result she and her two little children are fatally burned. When she was holding a babe in her arms and another child was standing near. Suddenly there was an explosion and the flames shot out and enveloped them all. Their clothing was burned off and their bodies were horribly charred.

## 260 Deaths of Her Fate.

CHICAGO, March 24.—Word has been received here to the effect that there no longer remains any doubt that Mrs. J. H. Stokes, of this city, who was a guest of the Windsor hotel, is burned in the ruins.

## Steel Workers Strike.

PITTSBURGH, Pa., March 24.—Six hundred employees of the Fox Pressed Steel Co. have quit work because the firm refused to grant an advance of 10 per cent. in their wages. The plant was idle Thursday.
