OVER THE LINE.

 resulted.

SHOWMEN IN TROUBLE.

 Friday night. Wallace and Under-
 wood were taken before Justice Frank

 examination, were bound over in the
 sum of \$1,000 and were lodged in the
 county jail.

GRAVES DESECRATED.

 intending to end her life. She is
 said to be the same girl who was
 prevented by a passer-by from jump-
 ing into the Ohio river from the sus-
 pension bridge at Cincinnati last May.
 Her parents were notified today.


