SIN

What Is It?—How Get Rid of It?—The Life of Holiness.

The worst thing in this world is sin. Sin is a reproach to any people. Prov. 14, 34. Sin divides, loves unites. Sin is the result of disobeying God. Whatsoever is not of faith is sin. Rom. 14, 23. Blessed is the person who is free from it. Sin ruins individuals. Sin ruins families. Sin ruins nations. We have a good example of its direful effects in the brutal struggle in Europe today.

It was through Adams transgressions that sin was entailed upon the whole human race. When God created Adam He put life into him, and the retention of this life depended entirely upon his obedience to God. He was created holy for we read that he was created in the image of God and the image of God is righteousness and true holiness. Eph. 4, 24. God said to Adam the day thou eatest the fruit of the tree in the midst of garden thou shalt surely die. But the Devil said that he would not die. So you see we have two kinds of religion. God's religion is a sinless religion, the Devil's religion a sinning religion. This may seem like a contradiction, but the Devil's religion is a perversion of the truth, a sort of half truth, a wresting of the scripture. If I try to make the bible harmonize with my doctrine, my life instead of making my life harmonize with the bible I have the Devil's religion.

It is a fact and a sad one that many of so-called christians advocate a sinning religion. They tell us it is impossible to live a sinless life. If this statement be true, the Devil was not far wrong according to the belief of many people, when he did his best to persuade Jesus to succumb to his wishes in the wilderness. If I am wrong in this statement, I will gladly recant. My bible says plainly "Whoever is born of God sinneth not," and I am not responsible for this saying. God said it. He also says "Let God be true and every man a liar." A person is a liar when he advocates a doctrine that is not in harmony with the plain teaching of the bible. This is the Devil's religion. Dare you deny this? If I am mistaken in this statement I certainly fail to understand my bible and am laboring under a tremendous error into which I have fallen.

The Devil hates holiness. He likes nothing better than a sinning religion. A life of sinning and repenting and repenting and sinning is one of the most delusive damnable heresies that has ever been conceived by the ingenuity of the Devil. It is a grossed plank on which he is sliding hundreds and thousands of souls into hell annually. The person who can not see holiness in every chapter of the bible should have a special oculist or optician examine his eyes and he will find there is something wrong with them.

Where my bible says once "Ye must be born again" it says twenty times "Be ye holy." How necessary it is that our ministers press holiness to the front; preach it pungently, definitely. Remember "Without holiness no man shall see the Lord." No one but those who have clean hands and a pure heart shall ascend into the hill of the Lord. The hill of the Lord means heaven.

To get rid of our sins we must be born again. This is the initial step to salvation and freedom from sin. Through Christ's death and burial we receive the forgiveness of sins and through His resurrection we are raised to a life of purity; a life of holiness; the likeness of His resurrection stamped in us. Do you want proof? Turn to Rom. 6, 5. "For if we have been planted together in the likeness of His death we shall be also in the likeness of His resurrection." How do we know what it means to be sanctified wholly. We have crossed the Jordan, saw the walls of Jericho tumble down, cleaned out the Canaanites, the Amorites, the Amalekites and all the rest of the ites, and feasting on corn and wine for all its riches are freely mine.

No more on Jordans stormy banks I stand, And cast a wishful eye, I have crossed and entered Canaan-land Where my possessions lie.

Now, brother this is holiness or sanctification. Call it what you choose. They are classified as synonyms by the most profound theologians. How obtained? By faith justification is a work God does for us; sanctification is a work God does in us, and is subsequent to regeneration. I can not explain it to you so you will get a clear conception of its meaning no more than I can explain justification. There are no external manifestations or demonstrations to prove a second work of grace. It can be known only by an experience. It is as broad as the universe, as high as heaven and as deep as profundity. Who can comprehend it?

There is a way by which each person possessing it, can distinguish the one from the other. In justification we have peace with God; in sanctification we have the presence of God. In the former we have faith in God; in the latter we love God; in the latter we have the love of God shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.

In addition to the above let me add this: The former makes us citizens in God's kingdom; the latter makes us soldiers. This is christian perfection. Better aim at perfection and miss it, than aim at imperfection and hit it. Brother, please study your bible carefully and if you find any thing like fanaticism in these statements let me know where they are and you will oblige your friend.

GEORGE LEININGER.

One of Fulton County's oldest citizens, Mr. Geo. Leininger of Archbold died on July 11th at the home of his son-in-law Mr. Charles Heupel.

Mr. Geo. Leininger was born November 26th, 1826, at Mennighoven near Straasburg, Alsace, which province was then a part of France. His father, Jacob Leininger, with his family, emigrated to America in 1837, embarking at Havre, France, September 22, and landing at New Orleans November 3.

Here the family, consisting of the parents, five sons, and two daughters, remained until April of the following year, when they continued their journey up the Mississippi and Ohio rivers to Cincinnati. After a short rest at this place, they proceeded by boat to Portsmouth, and then up the canal to Massillon, Stark County, and from there to Wooster in Wayne County, where they remained for two weeks with an uncle, who had come over in 1828. A homestead was then taken up in the woods six miles northeast of Wooster and the family settled down to pioneer life, living five and one half years at that place. From there they came to Fulton county, which was then still a part of Lucas county and Mr. Geo. Leininger has been a resident of this county ever since that time. In 1846
