

MISREPRESENTATION

Industrial Commission of Ohio Correct Perversion of Facts Concerning Workmen's Compensation Law—Efficiency of Present Administration Vindicated.

My attention has been directed to certain statements appearing in various daily papers intended to reflect upon the policy of the present administration towards the Workmen's Compensation Law. It would seem that there is a studied effort to have these statements appear at regular intervals so as to give unknown people the impression that there is now a less favorable attitude towards this law than was formerly the case.

It is stated for example that changes in the Industrial Commission have caused delay in the settlement of legitimate claims. The fact is that in the past four months since our organization (out of three members) was secured by the present state administration, there have been filed with the Industrial Commission, 28,744 claims as compared with 20,541 in the same four months of 1914. In other words, in these four months only 600 less claims have been filed and considered than in any previous month in the history of compensation insurance in Ohio. And without any increase in the force, 8900 more claims have been disposed of than in any similar period in the commission's history. At this very moment the auditing department is handling the checks for every claim reaching it within two days or almost a week more promptly than ever before in the history of the commission.

The present administration is perfectly willing to demonstrate to any disinterested person full evidence that the changes made have contributed to increased efficiency rather than otherwise. Less than 100 changes have been made out of a total 300 employed. Every competitive civil service employee has been retained. Only one example need be cited of what a change has accomplished. The removal of one auditor disclosed hundreds of letters, some of them months old, which had been carelessly neglected and unanswered, and included in these was a check for over \$250 which had been kept undisposed for several months. The new administration does not consider this kind of work efficient, whether done by Republicans or Democrats.

The commission has on file many hundreds of letters from employers commending it for its efficiency in the handling of payrolls on which premiums are based. Not a day goes by but that some of these are received and the commission considers them a better test than the partisan statement of a disappointed office seeker.

The industrial commission is not called upon to defend the ruling of

Judge Taggart; the insurance department is simply able to back up its own finding on the law as it was passed by former Governor Cox and his legislature. The "good faith" of the department is shown by the fact that quo warrants proceedings about to be instituted in the Supreme Court to test the questions raised, and certainly no administration can do more than this.

With the effect of the decision upon the work of the commission, however, it is concerned. The facts are that the decision has made no change whatever in the practice of the commission with reference to such companies. The records of the commission show that ever since June 1914 representatives of liability companies have appeared every week before the commission to present claims in which their companies are interested; exactly the same procedure as they have followed since the ruling. The report of the insurance department for 1914 shows that at the very time they were driven out of the state, private companies wrote more than 125 times as much compensation insurance as in 1913. The records also show that since the ruling only four companies have changed from state to private insurance, demonstrating completely the falsity of the charges that this ruling would destroy state insurance. The percentage as shown by the records is practically the same as that of the eighteen months preceding the ruling.

Moreover as to the justice of Judge Taggart's ruling, reference to critics is respectfully called to the statement of Hon. Wallace D. Yaple, Democratic member of the commission, at the Bar Association on July 9, 1913, in which he stated that section 54 (upon which the ruling is made) was put in the law for the very purpose of sanctioning contracts with private companies guaranteeing compensation such as the law provides.

SOLDIER'S MONUMENT

Final Arrangements Nearing Completion—Names To Be Inscribed on Bronze Tablets in Connection With Monument Must Be Filed By December 10th.

The trustees of The Fulton County Soldiers' and Sailors' Monuments and Memorial Association have been busy during the past few weeks completing the final arrangements for the building of the Fulton County Soldiers' and Sailors' Monument. The date for the dedication of the monument has been set for July Fourth, 1916. This date was preferred by the trustees for the reason that all old soldiers would be more likely to be free on that day than on Decoration Day when it is only natural that they do not care to attend gatherings in other places than their home towns and with their old associates and comrades. That is the one day in the year set aside and made sacred to the memory of the Comrades who have gone on before and every old soldier is anxious to do his part in seeing that the last resting places of comrades whose faces and voices linger only in memory, are suitably decorated with flowers and the flag. When the Fulton county monument is dedicated it is hoped that every living soldier and sailor in the county with their families may be present. It will be one of the greatest days in the history of the county, for it will gather up the memories of other days now long gone by, which were great in their significance not only to this county but to all the people of this country and bring them all to mind, as the monument which is the tangible expression of the gratitude, the respect and the honor accorded to the nation's defenders is dedicated.

The names of all soldiers so far as it is possible to ascertain them, who enlisted in the Union Army from Fulton county will be inscribed on Bronze Tablets which will be appropriately grouped about the monument.

There are four townships in the county from which the secretary has up to the present time, received no lists of soldiers who resided in those townships at time of enlistment. The trustees have decided that the names of all soldiers who have contributed \$5.00 or more to the monument fund and who did not live in Fulton county at the time of enlistment shall also be placed in tablets if requested and listed in the Union Army from Fulton county since the Civil War, who were not residents of Fulton county at the time of their enlistment and who have not contributed \$5.00 to the fund, may have their names together with regiment and company in which they served placed on tablets to be placed with the tablets mentioned above by paying one dollar to the Secretary of the Association. These

names must however, all be filed with the Secretary of the Association by Friday December the tenth. Soldiers or friends of soldiers who come in the class described above should act promptly in this matter. The one dollar simply covers the expense of having the name inscribed in bronze. Names and money should be sent or handed to Miss Kathryn Weir, Secretary Wauseon, Ohio.

ILL HEALTH The Reason Assigned for Suicide—Unable to Work and Suffering Physical Infirmities George Germann of Dover Ends His Life Sunday Night.

Last Sunday night, shortly after nine o'clock George Germann, aged sixty-three years died at his home in Dover township four miles north of Wauseon, following his having taken over an ounce of carbolic acid.

Doctors G. W. and F. C. Hartmann were called to the Germann home about nine o'clock and answered the call immediately, but Mr. Germann was dead before they arrived. He had poured a little more than an ounce of carbolic acid into a glass and swallowed it without the knowledge of the family, who upon discovering his condition immediately phoned for medical assistance, but it was too late and he died before the doctors arrived.

Mr. Germann has been in very poor health for the past two or three years and has been unable to do any work, this preyed upon his mind and he became despondent; recently his family state he has acted strangely and has not seemed to be exactly right in his mind. The deceased leaves a wife and twelve children. Funeral services were held Wednesday.

SPENCER FOUTY.
